Measure Description:

Requires HIV and other communicable disease testing to be done within 48 hours of the defendant’s arraignment on indictment. Results must be provided to the victim of the crime, or parent or guardian of the victim, and the defendant as soon as practicable and, any follow-up testing must be provided as deemed medically appropriate.
