The State Interoperability Executive Council (SIEC) was established under ORS 403.450 to be the State's interoperable communications governing body.

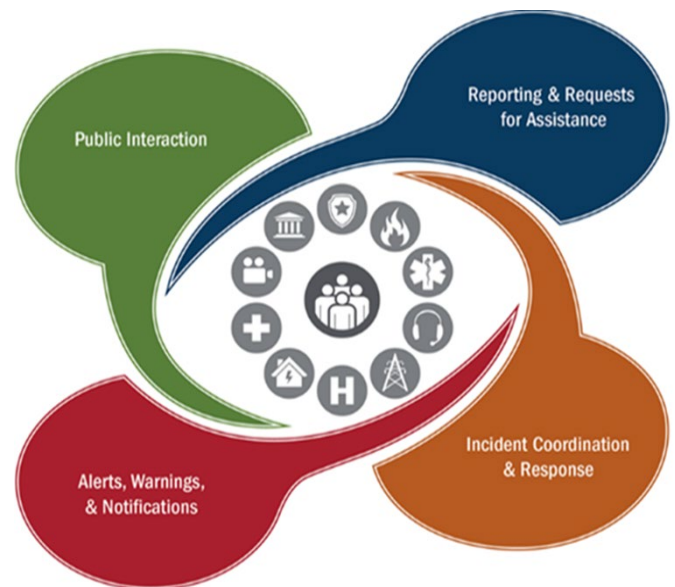
The SIEC serves as the primary steering group for the Oregon Statewide Communication Interoperability Plan (SCIP) and advises the governor on interoperable communications policy and investments.

Membership Consists of 22 Members including:

- Public Safety and Communications Representatives
- State, Local, County, Tribal Partners
- Public Safety Practitioners
- Legislators

The Council is broken into 5 committees and is focused on governance, funding and sustainment, technology, and training and exercise across the public safety communications ecosystem.

SIEC's Committee Structure



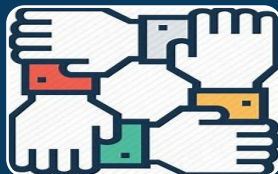
