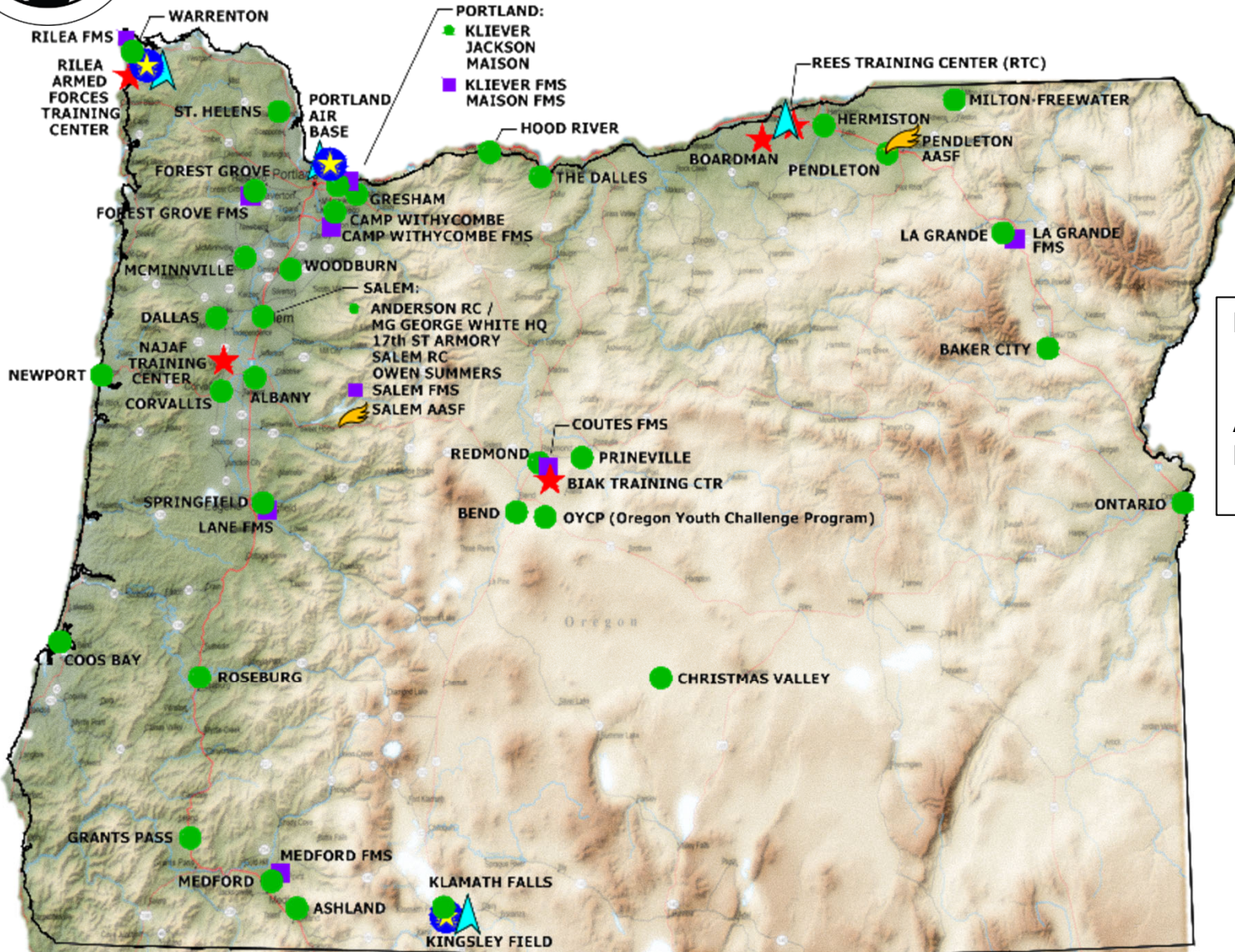

State Missions

Program/Unit	Personnel	Mission
National Guard Reaction Force (NGRF)	350 (50 Full-time)	Specially trained rapid response capability focused on incidents requiring law enforcement or security support.
102 CERFP (CBRN Enhanced Response Force Package)	208 (27 Full-time)	C2, search and extraction, mass casualty decontamination, and medical stabilization during major CBRN incidents.
102 Civil Support Team (CST)	15 Full-time	Identifies CBRNE agents/substances; assesses, advises and assists civil authorities at domestic CBRNE incidents.
Counter-Drug	22 Full-time	Supports local law enforcement with interdiction and assists community-based organizations in reducing substance use.
Operations Plan Smokey	12 Crews of 22 SM's (As Required)	Wildland firefighting support to Oregon Department of Forestry during wildland fire response.
142nd Civil Engineering Squadron Explosives Ordinance Disposal	13 (3 Full-time)	Supports local authorities in the disposal of found military munitions.
641 Aviation/ Special Tactics Squadron Search and Rescue	12 HH60, 6 CH47, 4 LUH72 Crews	Two UH-60 Black Hawks on standby at all times as well as battlefield airman with survival and search and rescue skills.
STARBASE	1 State Employee	Challenging STEM educational program targeting fifth graders through 25 hours of interaction with Oregon Guard Members.

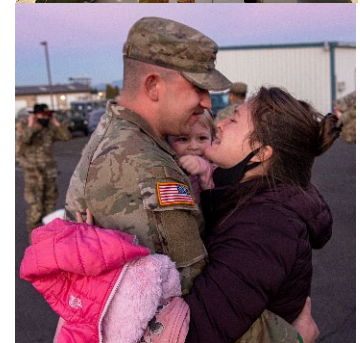

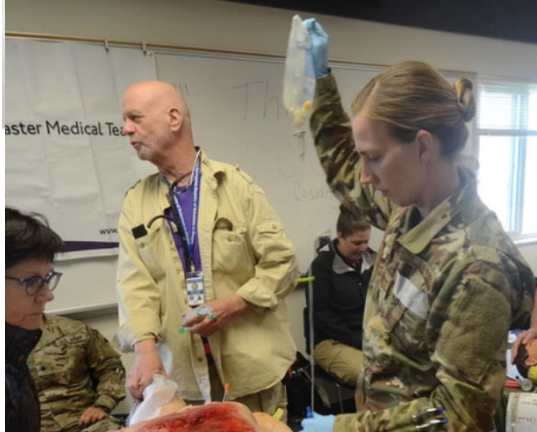
