Measure Description:

Allows school districts and public charter schools to award a high school equivalency diploma to a student in grades 11 or 12 who is at least 16 years old and who has passed an approved high school equivalency test, if the student's parent or guardian consents. Allows emancipated students or students who are 18 years of age to provide their own consent.
