

Number of Individuals an RFO Deputy Serves






These three slides are in response to Senator Gelser Blouin's, request on March 6, 2023, for graphics or related information regarding growth of homes served by the five RFO deputies statewide, staffing ratio, and geographic location of homes and facilities.

Beginning in 2015 the number of individuals each deputy ombudsman served was about 1444 living in 391 homes and/or facilities. As of the end of fiscal year (FY) 2021-2022, each deputy is now serving approximately 2,000 individuals living in 547 homes and/or facilities. This growth in the number of homes and/or facilities for Mental Health and Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities is expected to further increase with investments made by DHS/OHA to expand the number of homes/facilities available for individuals across the state. Specific to the committee's question, with only five direct-service staff, RFO is challenged with meeting the advocacy support needs of the vulnerable Oregonians served by the program.
