HB 2013 -3 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to study alcohol. Directs commission to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to economic development.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-3 Permits malt beverages, wine, and cider to products to be directly delivered to retailer in Oregon who holds? direct retailer and direct shipper permit issued by Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission. Holders of brewery-public house, temporary, on-premises, limited on-premises, and off-premises sales license are required to report each month on the quantity of malt beverage, wine or cider received form direct to retail permit holder.

Directs retailer permits to be issues to manufactures of malt beverages, wine, or cider that are a resident of the United States; is licensed by a state or territory to manufacture malt beverage, wine, or cider; and holds a certificate of approval. Direct- to- retail permit is caped at 7,500 barrels of malt beverage delivered peryear. Direct shipper permit allows for delivery directly to Oregon residents within limitations.Permit holder is required to keep records of quantity delivered and submit report chronicling previous three months of deliveries directly to Oregon residents.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

BACKGROUND:

House Bill 2013 requires Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission (OLCC) to study alcohol. Directs OLCC to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to economic development. The findings may include recommendations. the findings must be reported before September 15th, 2024.
