

**SB 393 -1, -2 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY**

**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Directs the Criminal Justice Commission to study the effect of different types of sentences on rates of recidivism.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 Replaces the measure. Prohibits a gun dealer from transferring a firearm unless 72 hours have elapsed since receipt of the unique approval number from the Department of State Police (OSP). Provides that a gun dealer is immune from civil liability for any use of the firearm by the recipient or transferee if the gun dealer allows 72 hours to elapse between receipt of the unique approval number and transfer of the firearm. Takes effect on the 91st day after adjournment sine die.

-2 Replaces the measure. Prohibits a gun dealer from transferring a firearm unless 72 hours have elapsed since receipt of the unique approval number from the Department of State Police (OSP). Provides that a gun dealer is immune from civil liability for any use of the firearm by the recipient or transferee if the gun dealer allows 72 hours to elapse between receipt of the unique approval number and transfer of the firearm. Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

**BACKGROUND:**

Under current law, a gun dealer may transfer a firearm to a transferee if the dealer receives a unique approval number from OSP and within 48 hours of completing the transfer, the dealer notifies OSP that the transfer has occurred.
