# WHAT DOC DOES FOR CRIME VICTIMS



**All crime victims and survivors treated with dignity and respect with the hope of reducing the challenges they face during the post-conviction period**

## Post-conviction support for crime victims

### ◆ Information ◆ Services ◆ Support ◆ Resources

- *Notification of the location, status, and custody level of the AIC(s), including notification if the AIC(s) is released or escapes from custody*
- *Notification of contact information for the institution where the AIC(s) is housed*
- *Information about the right to protection, including “no-contact” orders that prevent the AIC(s) from contacting the victim*
- *Providing information about and referrals to crime victim services in the community*
- *In cases involving violent crime, receiving information about the Crime Victim Compensation Program*
- *Submission of a Victim Impact Statement and information regarding its use and purpose*
- *The right to information about compliance during supervision in the community*
- *The opportunity to participate in a victim/offender dialogue program*

# HOW DOES DOC SERVE VICTIMS?

## Work at the National Level

- **National Association of Victims Assistance in Corrections (NAVAC)/ National Association of Victim Service Professionals in Corrections**
  - Chaired by Oregon DOC 2018-2022
- **National Institute of Corrections**
  - Oregon DOC appointed to the Post-Conviction Victim Service Providers Network 2016 to present.



# HOW DOES DOC SERVE VICTIMS?

## Work at the National Level (cont.)

- **National Crime Victims Research and Treatment Center (NCVC)**
  - Member Advisory Committee 2023
  - Developing mobile app for victims and survivors of crime
- **National Victim Offender Dialogue (VOD) Facilitator Training, NAVAC and NIC Collaboration**
  - Oregon DOC Project Coordinator and Writing Curriculum Writing
  - VOD = Oregon Facilitated Dialogue Program (FDP)



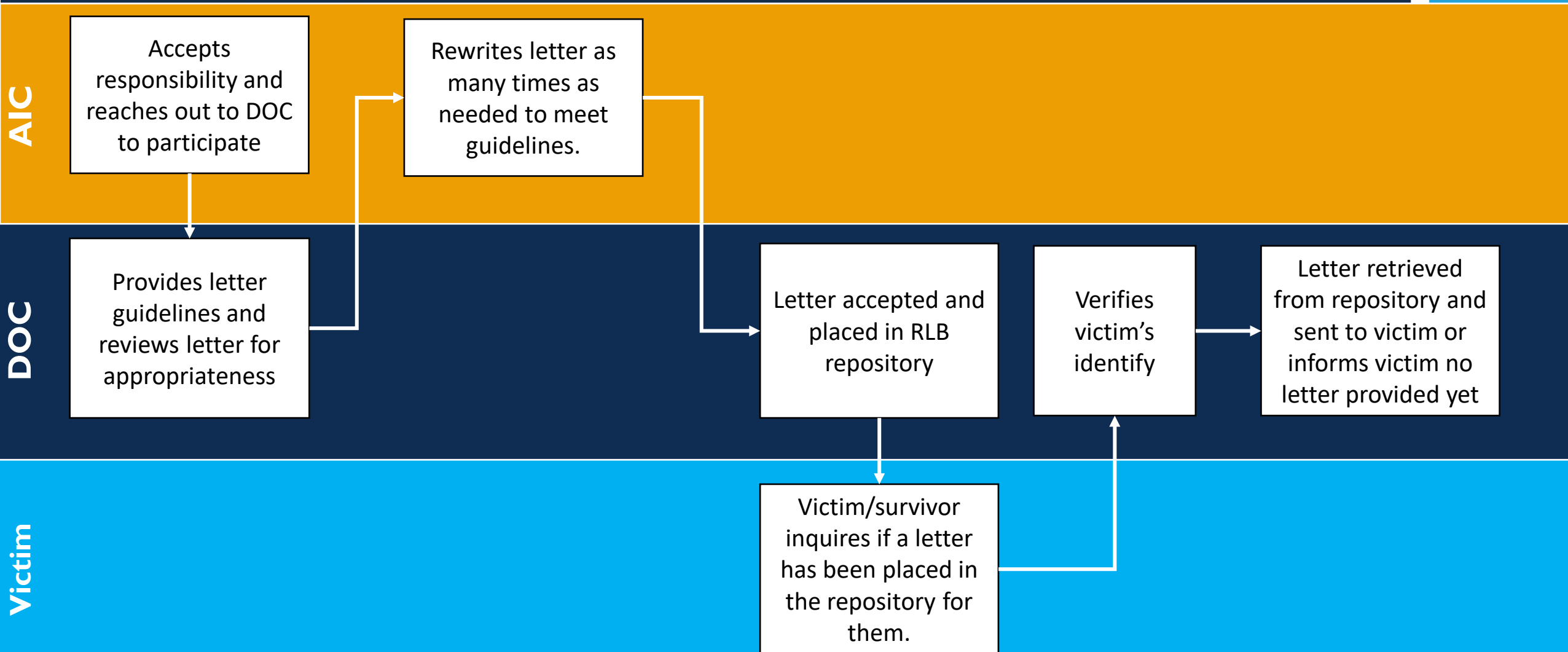

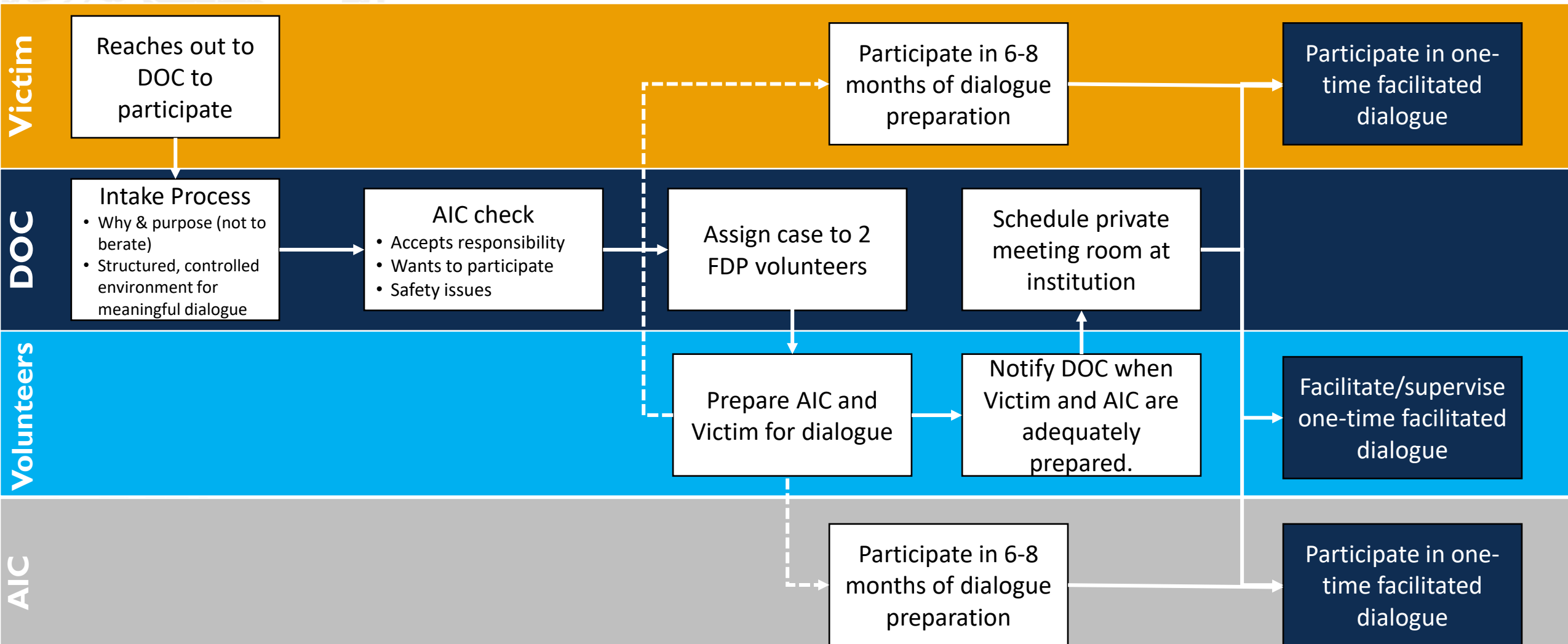
