OCID History

OCID Timeline Past, Present, and Future



2009-2019

Explored possibilities Initial guidance committee Oregon foster care system pilot

Built initial support with policymakers, agency leaders, private funders

Established initial dataset in partnership with 5 state agencies

2019-2021

Official launch in 2019-2021 with state appropriation & private match

Governance Committee established

Initial Child Well-being Dashboard, analyses

2021-2023

Analysis of the Oregon 2020 High School Graduation Class

Continued state appropriation

State Analyst Forum created

Broadening policymaker & stakeholder relationships

Data use agreements extended through 2028

New in-depth analyses

2023-2025

Dashboard redesign

Broadened engagement with policy and community stakeholders

- Non-partisan, objective resource to improve the well-being of all children in Oregon
- Oregon-specific, cross-program data across childhood
- Responsive and accessible in-depth analyses and interactive data visualizations
- Guided by state policymakers and community leaders

OCID's Data Landscape

- Integrated data across state agencies
 - > Oregon Department of Education
 - > Oregon Early Learning Division
 - > Oregon Department of Human Services
 - Oregon Health Authority
 - Oregon Youth Authority
- Complimentary state-run integrated data projects
 - State Longitudinal Data System (SLDS)
 - ODHS Office of Reporting, Research, Analytics and Implementation (ORRAI)
 - Children's System of Care Data Dashboard (SB1)

OCID Data Highlights

Oregon High School Class of 2020 Analytic Series



LIKELIHOOD OF GRADUATING IN 4 YEARS

Select predictors for the Oregon high school Class of 2020



In addition to the listed characteristics, the analysis controlled for sex/gender, deep poverty, prenatal tobacco exposure, and parents' education at birth. The strength of predictors across race and ethnicity groups was similar to those for the whole Class of 2020 cohort.

2020 Graduation Rates by Student and Family Characteristics

Four-year graduation rates of students in the 2020 class by student and family characteristics.

Oregon's Class of 2020 Series: Juvenile Justice Contact & 4-Year Graduation



11% of students in the Class of 2020 ever had justice system contact (N = 3,410).

4-YEAR GRADUATION RATES

No juvenile justice contact



Definition of juvenile justice system contact:

Youth that ever received a criminal referral, regardless of the outcome of that referral.

Oregon's Class of 2020 Series: Juvenile Justice Contact & 4-Year Graduation Timing and Severity



GRADUATION RATE BY NUMBER OF REFERRALS Total Number of referrals students % graduated in 4 years 2,300 61% 1 2 690 36% 3 29% 260 21% 4+ 140







4-YEAR GRADUATION RATES

Oregon's education system had lower 4-year graduation rates for students with disabilities and JJ contact.
