SUMMARY

Provides that "attempted transfer," for purposes of Uniform Controlled Substances Act, includes possession of controlled substance with intent to transfer to another person.

Increases penalties for possession of certain amounts of fentanyl. Punishes by maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both. Increases sentencing guidelines crime category level for delivery of fentanyl for consideration. Adds alternative manner of measuring fentanyl for purposes of calculating crime category level for certain offenses involving possession, delivery or manufacture of fentanyl.

Prescribes sentence of 58 to 130 months' imprisonment if person is convicted of unlawful manufacture or delivery for consideration of controlled substance that results in death of another person from use of controlled substance. Punishes by maximum of 20 years' imprisonment, \$375,000 fine, or both. Provides for immunity from prosecution if evidence of offense was discovered as result of person requesting medical assistance.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.
