Measure Description:

Creates crime of patronizing a trafficked child.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Youth Authority, District Attorneys, Judicial Department, Public Defense Services Commission, Department of Justice, Department of Corrections, Counties, Cities, Criminal Justice Commission

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transferring the measure from the House Committee on Education to the House Committee on Judiciary.

The measure creates a crime for patronizing a trafficked child as a Class C felony and directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) to consider patronizing a trafficked child as a felony in a specified crime category. This measure also authorizes the ex parte to expropriate communications when probable cause for patronizing a trafficked child exists and adds patronizing a trafficked child to the definition of sex crimes for sex offender reporting and patronizing a trafficked child to the list of crimes defining racketeering activity.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Judiciary.
