Measure Description:

Establishes Endangered Missing Person Alert System.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of State Police, Department of Human Services, Counties, Cities, Task Force/Committee/Workgroup, Department of Emergency Management, Higher Education Coordinating Commission, Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Confederated Tribes of Siletz, Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Burns Paiute Tribe, Confederated Tribes of Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians, Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation, Coquille Indian Tribe, Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Indians, Klamath tribes

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transferring the measure from the House Committee on Business and Labor to the House Committee on Emergency Management General Government and Veterans.

The measure establishes the Endangered Missing Person Alert System and directs the Superintendent of Oregon State Police (OSP) to establish a task force, who is required to design, develop, and implement the system. OSP and the Oregon Department of Emergency Management (ODEM) shall provide administrative oversight to the system and may recommend modifications.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Emergency Management General Government and Veterans.
