SUMMARY

Enacts Recognition of Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact. Permits Oregon Health Authority to disclose specified information to Interstate Commission for EMS Personnel Practice. Exempts individuals authorized to work under compact's privilege to practice from requirement to obtain authorization from authority. Allows authority to use moneys to meet financial obligations imposed on State of Oregon as result of participation in compact.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

OPEN GOVERNMENT IMPACT

Legislative Counsel has not adopted standards for drafting measures that establish exemptions from disclosure of public records.

This measure allows Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact member states contributing information to the coordinated database and reporting system to designate information that may not be shared with the public without the express permission of the contributing state.

If those public records that could be subject to public disclosure were instead subject to mandatory disclosure under public records law, the public could receive information from the coordinated database and reporting system that is designated as confidential or exempt from public disclosure by the contributing state.
