Measure Description:

Prohibits sale, offer for sale or trade of fur product in State of Oregon.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Justice, District Attorneys, Counties, Public Defense Services Commission, Department of Agriculture, Department of Corrections, Cities, Judicial Department, Oregon Youth Authority, Department of Consumer and Business Services, Criminal Justice Commission, Special Districts Association of Oregon, Department of the State Fire Marshal

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Economic Development and Small Business to the House Committee on Judiciary.

The measure prohibits a person from selling, offering to sell, or trading fur products in Oregon. Violation of the measure is a Class A misdemeanor, and the measure takes effect on the 91st day after sine die.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Judiciary.
