Analysis:

House Bill 3177 appropriates \$20 million General Fund to the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) in the 2023-25 biennium for deposit in the Educator Advancement Fund for recruiting and retaining educators and providing professional learning opportunities for educators. The measure takes effect on July 1, 2023.

ODE would distribute the appropriated funds as special payments to the Educator Advancement Fund. Once deposited in the Educator Advancement Fund, ODE would need an increase in Other Funds expenditure limitation to make special payments for recruiting, retaining, and providing professional learning opportunities for educators. Any increase in workload associated with these special payments is anticipated to be minimal and absorbable within ODE's 2023-25 current service level. The total estimated fiscal impact to ODE is \$40 million total funds in 2023-25, including \$20 million General Fund and \$20 million Other Funds.

The measure warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of its impact to the State's General Fund and ODE's biennial budget.
