**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Increases from two to five number of cases of cider or malt beverages, containing not more than nine liters per case, that holder of direct shipper permit may ship to Oregon resident per month.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Number of bottles in a case
- Volume of liquid allowed in a case
- Providing cider and malt beverages parity to wine
- Ability to access cider or malt beverages not widely available
- Public health impacts of alcohol
- Alternate forms of distribution

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

Oregon law requires a person to obtain a direct shipper permit to sell and ship malt beverages, wine, or cider directly to an Oregon resident. A person who makes such a direct shipment without having a direct shipper permit commits a Class A misdemeanor. Additionally, persons making these shipments are prohibited from knowingly or negligently delivering the malt beverages, wine, or cider to persons under age 21 or to persons who are visibly intoxicated.

Currently, the holder of a direct shipper permit may only ship up to two cases of cider or malt beverages that contain not more than nine liters per case and up to five cases of wine that contain not more than nine liters per case per month. Senate Bill 616 allows a direct shipper permit holder to ship up to five cases of cider or malt beverages, containing not more than nine liters per case, per month to Oregon resident.
