## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Modifies penalties for committing offense of throwing lighted material onto certain property.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Potential situations appropriate for a lower charge
- Need to define risk present for escalation of charge
- Enforcement of current provision

#### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

Deletes portion of measure modifying penalty for violating ORS 476.715. Provides that violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class B misdemeanor only if a person commits the offense on applicable land during a fire season or if the offense results in the ignition of a fire. In all other cases, provides that violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class A violation.

## **BACKGROUND:**

Current law, under ORS 476.715, prohibits individuals from throwing away any lighted material on any forestland, private road, public highway or railroad right of way within Oregon. A violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class B misdemeanor.

House Bill 2594 A provides that violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class B misdemeanor only if a person commits the offense on applicable land during a fire season or if the offense results in the ignition of a fire. In all other cases, the measure provides that violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class A violation.
