WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to conduct study to identify means of increasing access to advanced instruction and report to interim legislative committees by September 15, 2024. Sunsets January 2, 2025.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Need for advanced instruction for some students
- Cost of study

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Current law defines talented and gifted (TAG) children as those who demonstrate outstanding ability or potential in one of several academic, creative, or leadership areas and require special educational programs or services beyond those normally provided by the regular school program in order to realize their contribution to self and society. School districts are required to submit a plan of instruction for TAG children to ODE and may apply for state funds to provide TAG instruction. Senate Bill 736 requires the Oregon Department of Education to study means of increasing access to advanced instruction.
