WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

House Bill 5030 authorizes the issuance of lottery revenue bonds for specified projects.

A total of \$453 million of net lottery bond proceeds are authorized to be spent on 37 projects included in HB 5030. Total costs of issuance are estimated to be \$5.3 million and amounts required for debt service reserve accounts are estimated to be \$42.8 million. HB 5005 establishes statutory lottery revenue bond authority of \$501.1 million to allow for the issuance of lottery revenue bonds in HB 5030 generating proceeds for project costs, costs of issuance, and debt service reserves.

Authority to spend bond proceeds for project costs and pay for the cost of issuing bonds is included in the budget reconciliation bill (SB 5506). Lottery revenue bonds are scheduled to be issued in the of spring 2024 and 2025 and debt service payments in the 2023-25 biennium are estimated to be \$13.1 million. Lottery revenue bonds are authorized for the projects summarized below.

The measure also authorizes issuance of \$20 million in net proceeds in the 2025-27 biennium for the Coos Bay Channel Modification project funded in the Oregon Business Development Department.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 The introduced bill includes the lottery revenue bonds included in the Governor's Budget. The amendment replaces the bill with the lottery revenue bonds authorized in the 2023-25 Legislatively Adopted Budget.
