

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2049

1 On page 2 of the printed bill, line 11, after “of” delete the rest of the line and delete lines 12
2 through 36 and insert “21 members appointed as follows:

3 “(a) The Governor, after consultation with the State Chief Information Officer and the director
4 of the Oregon Cybersecurity Center of Excellence or the director’s designee, shall appoint 15 voting
5 members.

6 “(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one nonvoting member who is
7 a member of the House of Representatives.

8 “(c) The President of the Senate shall appoint one nonvoting member who is a member of the
9 Senate.

10 “(d) The Secretary of State shall appoint one ex officio, nonvoting member to represent the
11 Secretary of State.

12 “(e) The State Treasurer shall appoint one ex officio, nonvoting member to represent the State
13 Treasurer.

14 “(f) The Attorney General shall appoint one ex officio, nonvoting member to represent the At-
15 torney General.

16 “(g) The Director of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management shall appoint one ex
17 officio, nonvoting member to represent the Oregon Department of Emergency Management.

18 “(2)(a) The voting members of the council shall consist of:

19 “(A) One member who represents Indian tribes, as defined in ORS 97.740;

20 “(B) One member who represents the Association of Oregon Counties;

21 “(C) One member who represents the League of Oregon Cities;

22 “(D) One member who represents the Special Districts Association of Oregon;

23 “(E) One member who represents regional governments;

24 “(F) One member who represents the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;

25 “(G) One member who represents the Oregon School Boards Association;

26 “(H) One member who represents the Coalition of Oregon School Administrators;

27 “(I) One member who represents public universities listed in ORS 352.002;

28 “(J) One member who represents community colleges;

29 “(K) One member who represents the office of Enterprise Information Services;

30 “(L) One member who represents a critical infrastructure sector in Oregon as defined by the
31 Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency of the United States Department of Homeland
32 Security;

33 “(M) One member who represents cyber-related industries in Oregon;

34 “(N) One member who represents a public sector information technology association in Oregon;

35 and

1 “(O) One member who represents a private sector information technology or telecommunications
2 association in Oregon.

3 “(b) A majority of the council’s voting members must be geographically diverse representatives
4 of public universities listed in ORS 352.002, local governments, regional governments, special dis-
5 tricts, education service districts, school districts or libraries.”.

6 In line 37, before “member” insert “voting”.

7 In line 38, before “member” insert “voting”.

8 On page 3, after line 7, insert:

9 “(6) The nonvoting legislative members of the council shall serve two-year terms and are eligible
10 for reappointment.”.

11 In line 8, delete “(6)” and insert “(7)”.

12 In line 10, delete “(7)” and insert “(8)” and after “council” insert “who are not members of the
13 Legislative Assembly”.

14 In line 11, after “council” insert “who is not a member of the Legislative Assembly”.

15 After line 14, insert:

16 “(9) Members of the council who are members of the Legislative Assembly are entitled to com-
17 pensation and expense reimbursement as provided in ORS 171.072.”.

18 In line 15, delete “(8)” and insert “(10)”.

19 In line 19, after “Appoint” insert “additional”.

20 In line 20, delete “(9)” and insert “(11)”.

21 In line 25, before “members” insert “voting”.

22 In line 29, after “remaining” insert “voting”.

23 On page 6, line 21, after “(8)” insert “(a)” and delete “, as defined in ORS 174.111,”.

24 After line 24, insert:

25 “(b) As used in this subsection, ‘state government’ has the meaning given that term in ORS
26 174.111, except that ‘state government’ does not include the Secretary of State or State
27 Treasurer.”.

28
