# House Bill 2266

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Governor Kate Brown for Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies membership of State Interoperability Executive Council.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the State Interoperability Executive Council; amending ORS 403.450.

#### **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** ORS 403.450 is amended to read:

5 403.450. (1) The State Interoperability Executive Council is created under the State Chief In-

6 formation Officer to be the statewide interoperability governing body serving as the primary steer-

7 ing group for the Oregon Statewide Communication Interoperability Plan. The membership of the 8 council consists of:

9 (a) Two members from the Legislative Assembly, as follows:

10 (A) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from the Senate with an interest in

11 public safety communications infrastructure; and

12 (B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from the House of

13 Representatives with an interest in public safety and emergency communications infrastructure.

14 (b) The following members appointed by the Governor:

15 (A) One member from the Department of State Police;

- 16 (B) One member from the Oregon Department of Emergency Management;
- 17 (C) One member from the State Forestry Department;
- 18 (D) One member from the Department of Corrections;
- 19 (E) One member from the Department of Transportation;
- 20 (F) One member from the office of Enterprise Information Services;
- 21 (G) One member from the Oregon Health Authority;
- 22 (H) One member from the Oregon Military Department;
- 23 (I) One member from the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training;
- 24 (J) One member from the Oregon Broadband Advisory Council;
- 25 (K) One member from the Department of the State Fire Marshal;
- 26 [(K)] (L) One member of an Indian tribe as defined in ORS 97.740 or a designee of an Indian 27 tribe; and
- 28 [(L)] (**M**) One member of the public.
- 29 (c) The following members appointed by the Governor with the concurrence of the President of
- 30 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:
- 31 (A) One member from the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

(B) One member from the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police; 1 2 (C) One member from the Oregon State Sheriffs' Association; 3 (D) One member from the Association of Oregon Counties; (E) One member from the League of Oregon Cities; 4 (F) One member from the Special Districts Association of Oregon; 5 (G) One member who is an information technology officer of an Oregon city; 6 (H) One member who is an information technology officer of an Oregon county; 7 (I) One member who represents a nonprofit professional organization interested in the enhance-8 9 ment of public safety communications systems; [and] (J) One member of the public who works or resides in Federal Communications Commission 10 Region 35[.]; and 11 12(K) One member from the Oregon emergency management community. (2) Each agency or organization identified in subsection (1)(b)(A) to (J) and (1)(c)(A) to (H) of this 13section shall recommend an individual from the agency or organization for membership on the 14 15 council. 16 (3) Members of the council are not entitled to compensation, but in the discretion of the State Chief Information Officer may be reimbursed from funds available to the office of Enterprise Infor-17 18 mation Services for actual and necessary travel and other expenses the members incur in performing 19 the members' official duties in the manner and amount provided in ORS 292.495. 20(4) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the council are nonvoting members and 21may act in an advisory capacity only.
