SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to establish program to provide grants to nonprofit organization to fund care of retired law enforcement dogs. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for purposes of awarding grants.

[Declares emergency, effective on passage.]

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Public Safety Standards and Training shall establish

5 a program to provide grants to a nonprofit organization to fund the care of retired law 6 enforcement dogs.

7 (2) The department may award grants under this section to a nonprofit organization that

works with and advocates for working dogs and agrees to consult on applications for funding
 with:

10 (a) A representative of the Oregon Police Canine Association; and

11 (b) A representative of the veterinary industry.

(3) A nonprofit organization awarded a grant under this section may provide to a care taker of a retired law enforcement dog that meets the requirements of subsection (4) of this
 section:

(a) Up to \$1,000 per year to reimburse the caretaker for the costs of daily care and sup plies for the retired law enforcement dog; and

(b) Up to \$5,000 to reimburse the caretaker for emergency veterinary care for the retired
law enforcement dog.

(4) A caretaker of a retired law enforcement dog is eligible to receive funding under the
 program established in this section if the law enforcement agency that used the law
 enforcement dog certifies that:

(a) The retired law enforcement dog was medically retired from a law enforcement
 agency in this state due to an on-the-job injury or was used by a law enforcement agency in
 this state for at least 36 months;

25 (b) The retired law enforcement dog was certified in patrol or detection; and

(c) The law enforcement agency will notify the nonprofit organization when the law
 enforcement dog dies.

- 1 <u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-
- 2 ated to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, for the biennium beginning
- 3 July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$150,000, which may be expended for the
- 4 purposes of awarding grants under section 1 of this 2023 Act.
