

House Bill 2348

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Representative Jason Kropf)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study availability of community-based services for individuals who are on conditional release from civil commitment. Directs authority to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary not later than September 15, 2024. Sunsets January 2, 2025.

2 Relating to civil commitment.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The Oregon Health Authority shall study the availability of community-based**
5 **services for individuals who are on conditional release from civil commitment. The authority**
6 **shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommen-**
7 **dations for legislation to improve access to community-based services for individuals on**
8 **conditional release, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the**
9 **judiciary no later than September 15, 2024.**

10 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025.**
