## House Bill 2594

Sponsored by Representative MORGAN; Representatives HELFRICH, LEVY B, SCHARF, Senators GOLDEN, THATCHER (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Modifies penalties for throwing lighted material onto certain property. Punishes by maximum of \$1,000 fine, maximum of \$2,000 fine if commission of offense creates risk of wildfire and maximum of six months' imprisonment, \$2500 fine, or both, if commission of offense creates extreme risk of wildfire.

- 5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 476.990 is amended to read:

- 6 476.990. (1) Violation of ORS 476.150 (2) is a Class A misdemeanor.
- (2) Violation of ORS 476.380 (1) is a Class A misdemeanor.
  - (3) Violation of ORS 476.410 to 476.440 is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 9 (4) Violation of any provision of ORS 476.510 to 476.610 is a Class A misdemeanor.
- 10 (5) Subject to ORS 153.022, violation of ORS 476.710 [or 476.715] or of any rule or regulation of 11 the State Parks and Recreation Department promulgated thereunder is a Class B misdemeanor.
  - (6)(a) Except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subsection, violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class B violation.
  - (b) Violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class A violation if the commission of the offense creates a risk of wildfire.
  - (c) Violation of ORS 476.715 is a Class B misdemeanor if the commission of the offense creates an extreme risk of wildfire.
- SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 476.990 by section 1 of this 2023 Act apply to conduct occurring on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
