House Bill 3159

Sponsored by Representative HELM; Representatives GAMBA, HUDSON, Senators DEMBROW, GORSEK

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Increases state transient lodging tax. Changes name of Oregon Conservation Strategy Subaccount to Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund Subaccount. Transfers moneys attributable to increase of state transient lodging tax to Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund Subaccount.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to funding to support species conservation; creating new provisions; amending ORS 320.305, 2

3 320.335, 496.303 and 496.571; prescribing an effective date; and providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority. 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ Whereas Oregon residents have a strong and growing interest in healthy populations of native 6 flora and fauna and the habitats that sustain them; and

7 Whereas it is in the state's interest to enhance the State Department of Fish and Wildlife's 8 ability to conserve Oregon's fish, wildlife and habitats; and

- 9 Whereas population growth, development, climate change and other natural and manmade im-10 pacts contribute to increasing pressures on Oregon's fish, wildlife and habitats; and
- 11 Whereas it is in the state's interest to protect the stability of tourism revenues by maintaining 12and restoring Oregon's fish, wildlife and habitats; and

13Whereas it is in the state's interest to diversify and broaden the base of the State Department 14 of Fish and Wildlife's revenue stream in an equitable and sustainable manner; now, therefore,

15Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

16 SECTION 1. ORS 320.305 is amended to read:

17 320.305. (1)(a) A tax of [1.5] 3 percent is imposed on any consideration charged for the sale, 18 service or furnishing of transient lodging.

19 (b)(A) The tax must be computed on the total retail price, including all charges other than taxes, 20paid by a person for occupancy of the transient lodging.

21(B) The total retail price paid by a person for occupancy of transient lodging that is part of a 22travel package may be determined by reasonable and verifiable standards from books and records 23 kept in the ordinary course of the transient lodging tax collector's business.

24 (2) The tax imposed under this section becomes due when the occupancy of the transient lodging 25 with respect to which the tax is imposed ends.

26 (3)(a) The tax shall be collected by the transient lodging provider or transient lodging interme-27diary that collects the consideration charged for occupancy of the transient lodging, or a transient 28lodging intermediary described in ORS 320.300 (12)(c), as applicable.

29(b) The transient lodging tax collector may withhold a collection reimbursement charge of five 30 percent of the amount collected under this subsection.

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(4) The tax imposed under this section is in addition to and not in lieu of any local transient 1 2 lodging tax.

SECTION 2. ORS 320.335 is amended to read: 3

320.335. All moneys received by the Department of Revenue pursuant to ORS 320.305 to 320.340, 4 and interest thereon, shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be held in a suspense account estab-5 lished under ORS 293.445. After the payment of refunds: 6

(1) Moneys necessary to reimburse the Department of Revenue for the actual costs incurred by 7 the department in administering the state transient lodging tax, not to exceed two percent of state 8 9 transient lodging tax collections, are continuously appropriated to the department; and

(2) [The balance of the moneys received] Moneys received from the state transient lodging 10 tax imposed under ORS 320.305 at a rate equal to 1.5 percent shall be transferred to the account 11 12 of the Oregon Tourism Commission established under ORS 284.131. The moneys transferred under 13 this subsection are continuously appropriated to the [Oregon Tourism Commission] commission for the purposes set forth in ORS 284.131. 14

15 (3) Moneys received from the state transient lodging tax imposed under ORS 320.305 at a rate in excess of 1.5 percent shall be transferred to the subaccount of the Fish and Wildlife 16 Account established under ORS 496.303 (13). The moneys transferred under this subsection 17 are continuously appropriated to the department for the purposes set forth in ORS 496.303 18 (13). 19

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SECTION 3. ORS 496.303, as amended by section 8, chapter 56, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended to read: 21

22496.303. (1) The Fish and Wildlife Account is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. All moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the 23State Fish and Wildlife Commission. The Fish and Wildlife Account shall consist of the moneys in 24 its various subaccounts and any moneys transferred to the account by the Legislative Assembly. 25Unless otherwise specified by law, interest earnings on moneys in the account shall be paid into the 2627State Treasury and credited to the State Wildlife Fund.

(2)(a) The Fish Screening Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. The sub-2829account shall consist of:

30 (A) All penalties recovered under ORS 536.900 to 536.920.

31 (B) All moneys received pursuant to ORS 498.306.

32(C) All gifts, grants and other moneys from whatever source that may be used to carry out the provisions of ORS 498.306. 33

(D) All moneys received from the sale of angling licenses dedicated by ORS 497.124.

35 (b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used to carry out the provisions of ORS 315.138, 498.306 and 509.620. However, moneys received from the sale of angling licenses dedicated by ORS 36 37 497.124 shall be expended only to carry out the provisions of law relating to the screening of water 38 diversions.

(3) The Fish Endowment Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. The sub-39 account shall consist of transfers of moneys authorized by the Legislative Assembly from the State 40 Wildlife Fund and gifts and grants of moneys from whatever source for the purpose of paying the 41 expense of maintaining fish hatcheries operated by the department. 42

(4) The Migratory Waterfowl Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. All 43 moneys received by the commission from the sale of art works and prints related to the migratory 44 waterfowl stamps shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended 45

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only for activities that promote the propagation, conservation and recreational uses of migratory waterfowl and for activities related to the design, production, issuance and arrangements for sale of the migratory waterfowl stamps and related art works and prints. Expenditures of moneys in the subaccount may be made within this state, in other states or in foreign countries, in such amounts as the commission determines appropriate. Expenditures in other states and foreign countries shall be on such terms and conditions as the commission determines will benefit most directly the migratory waterfowl resources of this state.

8 (5) The Halibut Research Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. Based on 9 the annual number of recreational halibut anglers, a portion of the moneys derived from the sale 10 of the salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut tag pursuant to ORS 497.121 shall be credited 11 to the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only for halibut population studies 12 and other research.

13 (6) The Upland Bird Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. All moneys received by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission from the sale of upland bird stamps, from the 14 15 sale of any art works and prints related to the upland bird stamps and from private hunting preserve 16 permit fees shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only for promoting the propagation and conservation of upland birds and the acquisition, development, 17 18 management, enhancement, sale or exchange of upland bird habitat, and for activities related to the 19 design, production, issuance and arrangements for sale of the upland bird stamps and related art 20works and prints. Expenditures of moneys in the subaccount shall be made for the benefit of programs within this state in such amounts and at such times as the commission determines appropriate 2122to most directly benefit the upland bird resources of the state.

(7) The Access and Habitat Board Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account.
The subaccount shall consist of moneys transferred to the subaccount pursuant to ORS 496.242.
Moneys in the subaccount may be used for the purposes specified in ORS 496.242.

(8) The Marine Shellfish Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. Interest 2627earnings on moneys in the subaccount shall be credited to the subaccount. All moneys received by the commission from the sale of resident and nonresident shellfish licenses pursuant to ORS 497.121 28shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the protection and 2930 enhancement of shellfish for recreational purposes, including shellfish sanitation costs and the cost 31 of enforcement of wildlife laws pertaining to the taking of shellfish. The State Fish and Wildlife Director, or a designee, the Director of Agriculture, or a designee, and the Superintendent of State 32Police, or a designee, shall jointly make a recommendation to the Governor for inclusion in the 33 34 Governor's budget beginning July 1 of each odd-numbered year.

(9)(a) The Mountain Sheep Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consist ing of moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

(b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of mountain sheep, for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of mountain sheep habitat and for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most directly benefit mountain sheep resources of this state.

(10)(a) The Antelope Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consisting of
 moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

(b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of antelope,
for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of antelope habitat and
for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most directly benefit antelope

1 resources of this state.

2 (11)(a) The Mountain Goat Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consist-3 ing of moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

4 (b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of mountain 5 goats for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of mountain goat 6 habitat and for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most directly 7 benefit mountain goat resources of this state.

8 (12) The commission shall keep a record of all moneys deposited in the Fish and Wildlife Ac-9 count. The record shall indicate by separate cumulative accounts the sources from which the mon-10 eys are derived and the individual activity or programs against which each withdrawal is charged.

(13) The [Oregon Conservation Strategy] Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund Subaccount is
 established in the Fish and Wildlife Account.

13 (a) The subaccount shall consist of:

(A) All moneys received by the commission from the sale of habitat conservation stamps,
 prints and art works under ORS 496.571.

16 (B) All moneys received by the Department of Revenue under ORS 320.335 (3).

(C) Moneys appropriated to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife for deposit in the
 subaccount or otherwise transferred to the subaccount.

(D) Any gifts, grants, contributions or other donations for use as described in paragraph
(c) of this subsection that are received by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife from
any public or private source and caused to be deposited in the subaccount or otherwise
transferred to the subaccount.

23 24 (b) Interest earnings on moneys in the subaccount shall be credited to the subaccount.

(c) Moneys in the subaccount shall be used:

(A) To promote, implement, revise or enhance the policies in the "Oregon Conservation
Strategy," 2016, and the "Oregon Nearshore Strategy," 2016, or any subsequent iterations of
those policies, as determined by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife; and

(B) To satisfy the nonfederal fund matching requirements for a conservation or restora tion program designed to recover and manage the species in greatest need of conservation
 and the habitats essential to conservation of those species, as determined by the State De partment of Fish and Wildlife.

(d) Moneys in the subaccount may be used for activities related to the design, production,
 issuance and arrangement for sale of the habitat conservation stamps, prints and art works
 under ORS 496.571.

[All moneys received by the commission from the sale of habitat conservation stamps and from the sale of any art works and prints related to the habitat conservation stamp shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only to promote and implement habitat and species restoration, enhancement and viewing activities identified in the "Oregon Conservation Strategy," 2006, by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, and for activities related to the design, production, issuance and arrangements for sale of the habitat conservation stamps and related art works and prints.]

42 (14)(a) The Rogue-South Coast Research and Monitoring Subaccount is established in the Fish
43 and Wildlife Account, consisting of moneys collected under ORS 497.121 (1)(r) and (s).

(b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for research and monitoring that is consistent
 with the Rogue-South Coast Multi-Species Conservation and Management Plan the commission

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1 adopted in December 2021, as subsequently amended by the commission.

2 (c) The commission may amend the plan as needed.

3 (d) The commission shall make the current version of the plan publicly available on a website
4 of the commission or of the State Department of Fish and Wildlife.

5 **SECTION 4.** ORS 496.571 is amended to read:

6 496.571. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission may issue an annual habitat conservation 7 stamp. The fee for the stamp may not exceed \$50.

8 (2) The commission shall arrange, by contest or other appropriate means, for the selection of the 9 design of the annual habitat conservation stamp authorized by subsection (1) of this section and for 10 the production and sale of the stamps.

(3) The commission may produce the number of stamps the commission considers appropriate and may make stamps available for the creation of art prints and other related art works and may arrange for the sale of stamps, prints and art works to persons desiring to purchase those items.

(4) In carrying out its duties, functions and powers with regard to the habitat conservation
stamp, the commission may contract for the performance of those duties, functions and powers. The
contract may include, among other matters, provisions for advance payment or reimbursement for
services performed pursuant to the contract. All costs and expenses incurred pursuant to this section shall be paid from the [Oregon Conservation Strategy] Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund
Subaccount established under ORS 496.303.

20 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The amendments to ORS 320.305 and 320.335 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2023 21 Act apply to consideration charged on or after January 1, 2024, for the sale, service or fur-22 nishing of transient lodging.

23 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2023 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2023 24 regular session of the Eighty-second Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
