

House Bill 3203

Sponsored by Representative MCINTIRE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits economic interest filing requirements for district school board members to those serving school districts with 7,500 or more students in average daily membership.
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to filing of statement of economic interest by school board members; amending ORS 244.050;
3 and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 244.050, as amended by section 1, chapter 66, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended
6 to read:

7 244.050. (1) On or before April 15 of each year the following persons shall file with the Oregon
8 Government Ethics Commission a verified statement of economic interest as required under this
9 chapter:

10 (a) The Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Commissioner of the
11 Bureau of Labor and Industries, district attorneys and members of the Legislative Assembly.

12 (b) Any judicial officer, including justices of the peace and municipal judges, except any pro tem
13 judicial officer who does not otherwise serve as a judicial officer.

14 (c) Any candidate for a public office designated in paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection.

15 (d) The Deputy Attorney General.

16 (e) The Deputy Secretary of State.

17 (f) The Legislative Administrator, the Legislative Counsel, the Legislative Fiscal Officer, the
18 Legislative Policy and Research Director, the Secretary of the Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House
19 of Representatives and the Legislative Equity Officer.

20 (g) The president and vice presidents, or their administrative equivalents, in each public uni-
21 versity listed in ORS 352.002.

22 (h) The following state officers:

23 (A) Adjutant General.

24 (B) Director of Agriculture.

25 (C) Manager of State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation.

26 (D) Water Resources Director.

27 (E) Director of the Department of Environmental Quality.

6 (2) By April 15 next after the date an appointment takes effect, every appointed public official
7 on a board or commission listed in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the Oregon Govern-
8 ment Ethics Commission a statement of economic interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070
9 and 244.090.

10 (3) By April 15 next after the filing deadline for the primary election, each candidate described
11 in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as
12 required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

13 (4) Not later than the 40th day before the date of the statewide general election, each candidate
14 described in subsection (1) of this section who will appear on the statewide general election ballot
15 and who was not required to file a statement of economic interest under subsections (1) to (3) of this
16 section shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as required under ORS
17 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

18 (5) Subsections (1) to (3) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or
19 appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates on April 15.

20 (6) If a statement required to be filed under this section has not been received by the commis-
21 sion within five days after the date the statement is due, the commission shall notify the public of-
22 ficial or candidate and give the public official or candidate not less than 15 days to comply with the
23 requirements of this section. If the public official or candidate fails to comply by the date set by the
24 commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty as provided in ORS 244.350.

25 **SECTION 2. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
26 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**
27 **on its passage.**

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
