House Bill 3225

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs state agencies to offer reinstatement and back pay to employees who were terminated because of COVID-19 vaccine mandates.

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2 Relating to state employees affected by COVID-19 vaccine mandates.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "state agency" means any officer, board, com-5 mission, department, division or institution in the executive branch of state government.

6 (2) On the effective date of this 2023 Act, a state agency shall offer the opportunity for 7 reinstatement, with no loss of seniority or accrued benefits, to any person whose employ-8 ment was terminated because the person refused to obtain a vaccination against COVID-19

9 that was required as a condition of employment.

(3) An offer of reinstatement under this section expires 120 days after the effective date
of this 2023 Act.

12 (4) A state agency shall pay back pay to any employee reinstated under this section for

13 the period between the employee's termination and the employee's reinstatement.

14 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 1, 2025.

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
