SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Requires] Authorizes Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office, Commission on Hispanic Affairs, Commission on Black Affairs, Commission for Women and Commission on Asian and Pacific Islander Affairs to [each employ at least one paid intern] employ paid interns and staff necessary to supervise interns.

Appropriates moneys for purpose of employing interns.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2	Relating to advocacy commissions; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. The Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office, the Commission on Hispanic Af-
5	fairs, the Commission on Black Affairs, the Commission for Women and the Commission on
6	Asian and Pacific Islander Affairs may employ paid interns and the staff necessary to su-
7	pervise interns.
8	SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-
9	ated to the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023
10	out of the General Fund, the amount of \$, which may be expended for the purpose of
11	employing paid interns under section 1 of this 2023 Act.
12	SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
13	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect

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on its passage.
