

# A-Engrossed House Bill 3416

Ordered by the House April 10  
Including House Amendments dated April 10

Sponsored by Representatives SMITH G, MARSH, OWENS, GOMBERG

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys to Oregon Business Development Department for distribution to recipients for industrial lands projects.  
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to industrial lands projects; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Oregon Business Development Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$29,000,000 for the department to distribute according to the following schedule to be used by each recipient only for the respective industrial lands project there set forth:**
