House Bill 3493

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires employer to compensate employee for on-call shift for which employee must remain on or near employer's premises or such that employee cannot use scheduled on-call hours for personal purposes.

2	Relating to compensation for on-call shifts.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
5	(a) "Employee" and "employer" have the meanings given those terms in ORS 652.210.
6	(b) "On-call shift" means any time that an employer requires an employee to be available
7	to work or to contact the employer or wait to be contacted by the employer for the purpose
8	of determining whether the employee must report to work.
9	(2)(a) Except as otherwise required by ORS 653.412 to 653.485, an employer shall com-
10	pensate an employee who is scheduled for an on-call shift for which the employee is required
11	to remain on or nearby the premises of the employer or such that the employee is unable
12	to use the scheduled on-call hours effectively for the employee's personal purposes, regard-
13	less of whether the employee is asked by the employer to perform work.
14	(b) An employer shall pay an employee scheduled for an on-call shift described in para-
15	graph (a) of this subsection at least the applicable minimum wage rate specified in ORS
16	653.025.
17	(3) The requirements of this section do not apply to salaried employees described in ORS

653.020 (3).

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
