## House Bill 3596

Sponsored by Representative NOSSE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows person to practice surgical technology at health care facility if person has completed and is certified by specified apprenticeship program. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to surgical technologists; amending ORS 676.875; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. ORS 676.875, as amended by section 1, chapter 65, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended 4 to read:  $\mathbf{5}$ 

676.875. (1) A health care facility may not allow a person to practice surgical technology at the 6

health care facility unless the person provides the health care facility with documentation 7

8 showing that the person:

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(a)(A) [Provides the health care facility with documentation showing that the person] Has com-9 pleted an educational program for surgical technologists accredited by a national accreditation or-10 ganization approved by the Oregon Health Authority by rule; and 11

12 [(B)(i)] (B) Holds and maintains a:

[(I)] (i) Surgical technologist certification issued by a nationally accredited certifying organiza-13tion for surgical technologists approved by the authority by rule; or 14

[(II)] (ii) Subspeciality surgical assistant or surgical technologist certification, including but not 15 limited to a certified ophthalmic surgical assisting credential issued by the International Joint 16 17Commission on Allied Health Personnel in Ophthalmology or its successor organization, that is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies or its successor organization and ap-18 19 proved by the authority by rule; [or]

20 [(*ii*)] (b) Has completed and is certified by a registered apprenticeship program in surgical 21technology that:

22[(I)] (A) Is approved under ORS 660.002 to 660.210;

23[(II)] (B) Meets the requirements for, and requires participants to receive, certification by the 24National Center for Competency Testing or its successor organization;

25[(III)] (C) Upon completion awards certification accredited by the National Commission for 26 Certifying Agencies or its successor organization; and

27[(IV)] (**D**) Is approved by the authority by rule;

[(b)(A)] (c)(A) [Provides the health care facility with documentation showing that the person] Has 28 29 completed a training program for surgical technologists in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps 30 or Coast Guard of the United States or in the United States Public Health Service Commissioned 31 Corps; and

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1 (B) Every two years [completes] has completed 16 hours of continuing education approved by 2 the authority; or

3 [(c)(A)] (d)(A) [Provides the health care facility with documentation showing that the person]
4 Practiced surgical technology during at least two of the three years immediately preceding January
5 1, 2017:

6 (i) In a health care facility in Oregon or in another state; or

(ii) As an employee of an agency or institution of the federal government; and

8 (B) Every two years [completes] has completed 16 hours of continuing education approved by 9 the authority.

10 (2) Notwithstanding subsection [(1)(a)(B)(i)] (1)(a)(B) of this section, a health care facility may 11 allow a person who does not hold a certification described in subsection [(1)(a)(B)(i)] (1)(a)(B) of this 12 section to perform surgical technology at the health care facility for 12 months after the person 13 completes an educational program for surgical technologists accredited by a national accreditation 14 organization approved by the authority by rule.

15 (3) Notwithstanding subsection [(1)(a)(B)] (1)(b) of this section, a health care facility may allow 16 a person who does not hold a certification described in subsection (1)(a)(B) of this section to perform 17 surgical technology at the health care facility if the person:

(a) Is an apprentice, as defined in ORS 660.010, actively enrolled in a registered apprenticeship program in surgical technology described in subsection [(1)(a)(B)(ii)] (1)(b) of this section that requires the person to obtain on-the-job supervised training; and

(b) Is at all times while performing surgical technology provided adequate direct supervision as required by the standards for the registered apprenticeship program in which the person is enrolled.

23 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect 25 on its passage.

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
