SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for State School Fund.
Limits biennial expenditures from lottery moneys allocated to department for State School Fund.
Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department for State School Fund.
Specifies amounts department may spend for certain purposes from State School Fund.
Transfers moneys from State School Fund to Local Option Equalization Grants Account.
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the state financial administration of the Department of Education; and declaring an
3 emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-**
6 **ated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the**
7 **General Fund, the amount of \$8,810,156,745 for the State School Fund.**

8 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
9 **\$646,538,037 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for**
10 **payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-**
11 **nomic Development Fund to the Department of Education for the State School Fund.**

12 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
13 **\$41,350,395 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for**
14 **payment of expenses by the Department of Education from fees, moneys or other revenues,**
15 **including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds and funds de-**
16 **scribed in section 4 of this 2023 Act, collected or received by the department for the State**
17 **School Fund.**

18 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
19 **\$701,954,823 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for**
20 **payment of expenses by the Department of Education from fees, moneys or other revenues,**
21 **including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or**
22 **received by the department for the State School Fund from the Fund for Student Success**
23 **established under ORS 327.001.**

24 **SECTION 5. Notwithstanding ORS 327.008 and 327.013, for the biennium beginning July**

1 **1, 2023, the Department of Education:**

2 (1) May spend up to \$968,000 from the State School Fund for the contract described in
3 **ORS 329.488.**

4 (2) May spend up to \$1,600,000 from the State School Fund for purposes related to Oregon
5 **Digital Learning.**

6 (3) May spend up to \$3,000,000 from the State School Fund for the School Safety and
7 **Emergency Management program.**

8 (4) May transfer up to \$4,268,766 from the State School Fund to the Oregon Military De-
9 **partment for the Oregon Youth Challenge Program.**

10 **SECTION 6. The amount of \$4,000,000 is transferred from the State School Fund to the**
11 **Local Option Equalization Grants Account created in ORS 327.339.**

12 **SECTION 7. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**
14 **July 1, 2023.**

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
