**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists and Oregon Board of Psychology.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

Relating to the financial administration of specified boards; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$3,985,666 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists.**

**SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,788,602 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Board of Psychology.**

**SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.**
