Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

2	Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-
5	ated to the Employment Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the
6	General Fund, the amount of \$5,767,819, for administrative expenses related to unemploy-
7	ment insurance and shared services.
8	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
9	expenditures established by section 4, chapter, Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled Senate Bill
10	5507), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses
11	from federal funds, other than those described in section 2, chapter, Oregon Laws 2023
12	(Enrolled Senate Bill 5507), collected or received by the Employment Department, is de-
13	creased by \$2,097,000.
14	SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
July 1, 2023.
