## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1043

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 28 and delete page 2 and insert: 1 2 "SECTION 2. (1) Upon the discharge or release of a patient, a hospital licensed under this 3 chapter shall provide to the patient at least two doses of an opioid overdose reversal medication and the necessary medical supplies to administer the medication if: 4 5 "(a) The hospital actively treated the patient for the patient's opioid use disorder; and 6 "(b) The patient is discharged or released to an unlicensed private residence or other 7 unlicensed setting. "(2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a person who is acting in 8 9 good faith, if the act does not constitute wanton misconduct, is immune from civil liability 10 for any act or omission of an act committed during the course of providing to a patient 11 opioid overdose reversal medications, and the necessary medical supplies to administer the 12medications, under subsection (1) of this section. 13 "(b) This subsection does not apply to a person involved in the manufacture or sale of 14 opioid overdose reversal medication. 15"(3) The requirements of subsection (1) of this section do not apply if a patient leaves the 16 hospital against medical advice. 17 "SECTION 3. (1) As used in this section, 'facility' means a: 18 "(a) Sobering facility registered under ORS 430.262; or 19 "(b) Facility licensed, certified or otherwise authorized by a public body to provide 20 detoxification services for substance use. 21(2) Notwithstanding ORS 689.681, upon the discharge or release of an individual, a facil-22ity shall provide to the individual at least two doses of an opioid overdose reversal medication 23 and the necessary medical supplies to administer the medication if the individual: 24"(a) Received addiction treatment at the facility for a current opioid use disorder; and 25"(b) Is discharged or released to an unlicensed private residence or other unlicensed 26setting. 27"(3)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a person who is acting in 28good faith, if the act does not constitute wanton misconduct, is immune from civil liability 29 for any act or omission of an act committed during the course of providing to an individual 30 opioid overdose reversal medications, and the necessary medical supplies to administer the 31 medications, under subsection (2) of this section. 32"(b) This subsection does not apply to a person involved in the manufacture or sale of 33 opioid overdose reversal medication. "(4) The requirements of subsection (2) of this section do not apply if an individual leaves 34 35the facility against the facility's advice.

1 "<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) As used in this section, 'facility' means a residential treatment facility 2 or residential treatment home, as those terms are defined in ORS 443.400, that is licensed 3 under ORS 443.410 (2).

4 "(2) Notwithstanding ORS 689.681, upon the discharge or release of a resident, a facility 5 shall provide to the resident at least two doses of an opioid overdose reversal medication and 6 the necessary medical supplies to administer the medication if:

7 "(a) The resident received addiction treatment at the facility for a current opioid use
8 disorder; and

9 "(b) The resident is discharged or released to an unlicensed private residence or other 10 unlicensed setting.

"(3)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a person who is acting in good faith, if the act does not constitute wanton misconduct, is immune from civil liability for any act or omission of an act committed during the course of providing to a resident opioid overdose reversal medications, and the necessary medical supplies to administer the medications, under subsection (2) of this section.

16 "(b) This subsection does not apply to a person involved in the manufacture or sale of 17 opioid overdose reversal medication.

18 "(4) The requirements of subsection (2) of this section do not apply if a resident leaves 19 the facility against the facility's advice.

<u>\*SECTION 5.</u> The Oregon Health Authority shall facilitate access to opioid overdose reversal medications and the necessary medical supplies to administer the medication for
hospitals licensed under ORS chapter 441, facilities as defined in section 3 of this 2023 Act
and residential facilities licensed under ORS 443.410 for the purposes of carrying out sections
2, 3 and 4 of this 2023 Act.".

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
