

Senate Bill 1056

Sponsored by Senator THATCHER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies offense of making a false report of child abuse. Punishes first or second offense by maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both. Punishes third or subsequent offense by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2 Relating to false reports of child abuse; creating new provisions; amending ORS 419B.016; and pre-
3 scribing an effective date.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 419B.016 is amended to read:

6 419B.016. (1) A person commits the [*offense*] **crime** of making a false report of child abuse if[,
7 *with the intent to influence a custody, parenting time, visitation or child support decision,*] the person:

8 (a) Makes a false report of child abuse to the Department of Human Services or a law enforce-
9 ment agency, knowing that the report is false; or

10 (b) With the intent that a public or private official make a report of child abuse to the Depart-
11 ment of Human Services or a law enforcement agency, makes a false report of child abuse to the
12 public or private official, knowing that the report is false.

13 (2) Making a false report of child abuse is a Class A [*violation*] **misdemeanor for a first or**
14 **second offense, and a Class C felony for a third or subsequent offense.**

15 **SECTION 2.** The amendments to ORS 419B.016 by section 1 of this 2023 Act apply to false
16 reports of child abuse made on or after the effective date of this 2023 Act.

17 **SECTION 3.** This 2023 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2023
18 regular session of the Eighty-second Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
