- **SECTION 2.** Section 7, chapter 98, Oregon Laws 2018, as amended by section 21, chapter 78, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended to read:
 - Sec. 7. Section 5, chapter 98, Oregon Laws 2018, is repealed on July 1, [2024] 2033.
- **SECTION 3.** Section 8, chapter 649, Oregon Laws 2013, as amended by section 22, chapter 78, Oregon Laws 2022, is amended to read:
