

Senate Bill 552

Sponsored by Senators SOLLMAN, PATTERSON, Representatives REYNOLDS, BYNUM, DEXTER; Senators CAMPOS, DEMBROW, FREDERICK, Representatives GAMBA, HUDSON, NELSON, NOSSE (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for school-based health resources.
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to lottery bonds; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** (1) **For the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, at the request of the Department of Education, the State Treasurer is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS**
5 **286A.560 to 286A.585 in an amount that produces \$10 million in net proceeds for the purposes**
6 **described in subsection (2) of this section, plus an additional amount estimated by the State**
7 **Treasurer to be necessary to pay bond-related costs.**

9 **(2) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued under this section must be transferred to the**
10 **department for distribution as grants to 20 school districts or education service districts to**
11 **increase access to school-based resources for mental, behavioral and physical health of**
12 **youth.**

13 **(3) The Legislative Assembly finds that the use of lottery bond proceeds will create jobs,**
14 **further economic development, finance public education or restore and protect parks,**
15 **beaches, watersheds and native fish and wildlife, and is authorized based on the finding that**
16 **improving access to school-based health resources will improve educational outcomes and**
17 **create jobs.**

18 **SECTION 2.** **This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
19 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect**
20 **July 1, 2023.**
