## A-Engrossed Senate Bill 5520

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Long Term Care Ombudsman for biennial expenses. Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal Older Americans Act funds received from Department of Human Services, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by Long Term Care Ombudsman.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2023.

5	SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Long Term Care Ombudsman, for the

13	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
14	\$1,209,977 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for
15	payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,209,977 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and including federal Older Americans Act funds received from the Department of Human Services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Long Term Care Ombudsman.

SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.
