"(a) Oregon Business Development Fund (ORS 285B.092), Oregon Entrepreneurial Development Loan Fund (ORS 285B.758), Credit Enhancement Fund (ORS 285B.215) and Small
Business Expansion Loan Fund (ORS 285B.133).

"(b) Special Public Works Fund (ORS 285B.455), Water Fund (ORS 285B.563), Marine
Navigation Improvement Fund (ORS 777.267), Oregon Port Revolving Fund (ORS 285A.708),
Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund (ORS 285A.213), Brownfields Redevelopment Fund

10 (ORS 285A.188) and Oregon Brownfield Properties Revitalization Fund (ORS 285A.198).

"(2) Debt service, excluding debt service on lottery revenue bonds and general obligation
 bonds.

"SECTION 11. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect
July 1, 2023.".

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
