PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2764

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, delete "; and declaring 2 an emergency".

3 Delete lines 6 through 25 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **"SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

5 "(a) 'Missing endangered person alert' means an alert issued 6 through the Missing Endangered Person Alert System.

"(b) 'Missing person' means a person whose whereabouts are unknown to a parent, guardian, caretaker or other person who has regular contact with the missing person.

"(2) There is established a statewide alert system to be known as
 the Missing Endangered Person Alert System.

12 "(3) The Missing Endangered Person Alert System shall be devel-13 oped and implemented by the Department of State Police as a program 14 of voluntary cooperation between broadcasters, cable systems and lo-15 cal and state agencies to enhance the ability of the public to assist in 16 locating and recovering missing and endangered persons.

17 "(4) The Superintendent of State Police shall establish a task force 18 to develop the Missing Endangered Person Alert System. Members of 19 the task force shall be appointed by the superintendent. The super-20 intendent or a designee of the superintendent shall serve as the chair 21 of the task force. The task force must include one representative each

1 **from:**

2 "(a) A statewide association of county sheriffs;

3 "(b) A statewide association of municipal chiefs of police;

4 "(c) Police departments established by a university under ORS
5 352.121 or 353.125;

6 "(d) A statewide organization of news broadcasters;

7 "(e) A statewide organization of cable service providers;

8 "(f) The Oregon Department of Emergency Management;

9 "(g) The Oregon Disabilities Commission;

10 "(h) The Department of Human Services;

11 "(i) The Department of Transportation; and

¹² "(j) The Governor's Commission on Senior Services.

"(5) The superintendent may satisfy the requirements of subsection (4) of this section by merging the existing Amber Alert committee with the task force described in subsection (4) of this section, provided the representation described in subsection (4) is reflected in the merged entity. At the option of tribal governments, as defined in ORS 181A.940, the task force may include a tribal government representative.

"(6) The task force shall design and the Department of State Police 20shall implement the Missing Endangered Person Alert System as a 21component of the missing children and adults clearinghouse estab-22lished and maintained pursuant to ORS 181A.300. The system shall 23provide for the use of the emergency notification system described in 24ORS 401.094, and any other emergency communication network or 25system as the task force may recommend to ensure rapid and effective 26dissemination of information to the public pertaining to a missing 27person to facilitate the rapid location and recovery of the missing 2829 person.

30 "(7) The Department of State Police, in consultation with the

Oregon Department of Emergency Management, shall implement and provide administrative oversight to the Missing Endangered Person Alert System, and may at any time recommend revisions to the system.

5 "(8)(a) A missing endangered person alert may not be issued under 6 the same criteria as are used for an alert under the state Amber Plan 7 described in ORS 181A.315 and shall not be distributed automatically 8 statewide. A missing endangered person alert may be issued outside 9 of existing policies adopted under ORS 181A.320.

10 "(b) A missing endangered person alert may be distributed based 11 on the geographic area in which the missing person was last seen or 12 is believed to be. A missing endangered person alert shall be issued 13 with the information available to law enforcement agencies at the 14 time the alert is made, and the lack of detailed information need not 15 preclude issuance of the alert.

"(9) For an incident to qualify for issuance of a missing endangered
 person alert, an individual, regardless of age:

18 "(a) Must be reported missing to a law enforcement agency;

"(b) Must be entered into National Crime Information Center re cords by the investigating agency;

"(c) Must be, or must be believed to be, a temporary or permanent
resident of Oregon or a person who is on vacation and is, or is believed
to be, at a location in Oregon;

"(d) Must be at a location that cannot be determined by a person
familiar with the missing person; and

26 "(e) Must be someone:

"(A) Who is missing as the result of abduction by a stranger and
who does not meet the criteria for an alert under the state Amber Plan
described in ORS 181A.315;

30 "(B) Who is missing under unexplained, involuntary or suspicious

1 circumstances;

"(C) Whose disappearance may be the result of the commission of
a crime;

4 "(D) Whose disappearance occurred under circumstances that are
 5 inherently dangerous;

"(E) Who is in need of medical attention or prescription medication;
"(F) Who has previously been the victim of a threat of violence or
an act of violence; or

9 "(G) Who is incapable of returning to the missing person's resi-10 dence without assistance because of:

11 "(i) An impaired mental condition, such as dementia;

12 "(ii) An intellectual or developmental disability;

13 "(iii) A brain injury;

14 "(iv) Weather conditions; or

"(v) Another physical or mental incapacity that requires care of the
 individual or management of the individual's property.

"(10) Before requesting activation of a missing endangered person 17 alert, a law enforcement agency shall verify that the criteria described 18 in subsection (9) of this section have been satisfied. The law enforce-19 ment agency shall assess the appropriate boundaries for dissemination 20of the alert based on the nature of the endangerment and the cir-21cumstances surrounding the last known location of the missing person 22or of a person who may have been involved in events that led to the 23disappearance of the missing person. 24

"(11) The state police shall terminate a missing endangered person
 alert with respect to a particular incident if:

"(a) The missing person is located or the incident is otherwise resolved; or

"(b) The state police determine that the missing endangered person
 alert is no longer an effective method for locating the missing person.

1 "(12) A law enforcement agency shall immediately notify the law 2 enforcement agency that initiated the alert and the state police when 3 the missing person, a vehicle associated with the missing person or a 4 person suspected of being involved in the disappearance of the missing 5 person has been located.

6 "(13) There shall be no required waiting period before a law 7 enforcement agency may initiate a missing endangered person alert 8 or otherwise report on or investigate facts and circumstances per-9 taining to the missing person or the disappearance of the missing 10 person.

"(14) Any person, organization or entity involved in the dissemination of a missing endangered person alert initiated under the system developed pursuant to this section may not be liable for any damages arising from the dissemination.".

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
