PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2872

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 28 and delete page 2 2 and insert:

³ "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:

4 "(a) 'Eligible children' means children from birth to five years of
5 age who reside in this state.

6 "(b) 'National nonprofit foundation' means a national nonprofit 7 foundation that exists for the purpose of working with local entities 8 to identify eligible children and mail age-appropriate, high quality 9 books each month to those children at no cost to families.

"(2) The Imagination Library of Oregon Program is established. The
 purposes of the program are to:

12 "(a) Provide a free book each month to eligible children;

 with, coordinating and providing oversight of a nonprofit entity that

 book-gifting programs in those communities;

"(d) Recruit community partners to assist in the implementation

"(5) The Early Learning Council, in consultation with the depart8 ment, may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Oregon Imagination Library Account is established within the Department of Early Learning and Care Fund.
Separate records shall be maintained for moneys in the account. Interest earned by the account shall be credited to the account.

"(2) Moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the
 Department of Early Learning and Care for the Imagination Library
 of Oregon Program established in section 1 of this 2023 Act.

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
 declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.".

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
