**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3303**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 6, delete “Department of Administrative
2 Services” and insert “Health Authority”.

3 In line 21, delete “Department of Administrative Services” and insert
4 “Health Authority”.

5 In line 28, delete “Department of Adminis-”.

6 In line 29, delete “trative Services” and insert “Health Authority”.

7 Delete lines 30 through 32 and delete page 2.

8 On page 3, delete lines 1 through 15 and insert:

9 **“SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section and section 1 of this 2023
10 Act:**

11 **“(a) ‘Client’ means an individual or family seeking a referral from
12 or who is being referred by a provider for needed services and sup-
13 ports.**

14 **“(b) ‘Community information exchange’ or ‘exchange’ means a
15 network of collaborating providers using a multidirectional technology
16 platform, that includes a shared resource directory and closed loop
17 referrals, to connect individuals and families to needed services and
18 supports such as food, housing, transportation and health care.**

19 **“(c) ‘Provider’ means:**

20 **“(A) A social services agency;**

21 **“(B) A community-based organization;**

1 “(C) A health care provider; or

2 “(D) Any other entity participating in a community information
3 exchange that provides services or supports in a community.

4 “(d) ‘Social services data’ includes:

5 “(A) Identifying information regarding clients;

6 “(B) The name of a provider that is referring a client;

7 “(C) Notes that may be entered into an electronic record by a pro-
8 vider regarding a client, such as an evaluation or assessment of the
9 individual’s or family’s needs;

10 “(D) The name of an entity to which a client is referred;

11 “(E) Whether a referral has been acted upon by the receiving entity;

12 “(F) Outcomes of referrals; and

13 “(G) Other information that may be used to pinpoint where addi-
14 tional or fewer resources are needed.

15 “(2) The Community Information Exchange Board established in
16 section 1 of this 2023 Act shall study community information ex-
17 changes and make recommendations on best practices for the use of
18 community information exchanges by:

19 “(a) Exploring the sharing of social services data by providers;

20 “(b) Identifying gaps in, needs for and barriers to the sharing of
21 social services data by providers;

22 “(c) Identifying best practice elements and areas for improvement
23 in systems that share social services data so that the resources of this
24 state may be directed to the systems identified as aligning with best
25 practices;

26 “(d) Identifying use cases for state programs to align with commu-
27 nity information exchanges; and

28 “(e) Identifying ways to support providers with training and capac-
29 ity building through funding, grants, technical assistance and other
30 resources so the providers can utilize systems for sharing social ser-

1 vices data.

2 “(3) The work of the board shall be informed by the report of the
3 stakeholder groups convened by the Health Information Technology
4 Oversight Council under section 1, chapter 10, Oregon Laws 2022.

5 “(4) The board shall appoint the following work groups:

6 “(a) A provider funding and support work group that shall:

7 “(A) Identify sustainable funding and grants and technical assist-
8 ance that will be needed for community information exchanges;

9 “(B) Identify gaps in and barriers to participation by providers
10 participating in the sharing of social services data; and

11 “(C) Connect with existing regional health equity coalitions, as de-
12 fined in ORS 413.256, Early Learning Hubs designated under ORS
13 417.827, community advisory councils described in ORS 414.575 and
14 other local organizations, to inform the work of the board.

15 “(b) A technical advisory committee consisting of technical experts
16 and a geographic representation of community information exchange
17 technology vendors, to inform the board concerning:

18 “(A) Privacy and security of data;

19 “(B) Technology systems; and

20 “(C) Interoperability and national standards for the exchange of
21 social services data.

22 “(c) Other regional focus groups, work groups or committees the
23 board determines necessary to support the board’s goals.

24 “(5) The board shall implement a plan to measure the success of the
25 community information exchange in facilitating and coordinating cli-
26 ent referral for services and supports and annually report the plan and
27 the findings under the plan, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245,
28 to the committees or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly
29 related to early childhood and human services.

30 “(6) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are

1 **directed to assist the board in the performance of the board’s duties**
2 **and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to**
3 **furnish such information and advice as the members of the board**
4 **consider necessary to perform their duties.”.**

5 In line 16, delete “Department of Administrative Services” and insert
6 “Health Authority”.

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
