PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2793

In line 2 of the printed bill, after "transportation" insert "; creating new 1 provisions; amending ORS 802.348; and declaring an emergency". 2 Delete lines 4 through 11 and insert: 3 "SECTION 1. (1) The Jurisdictional Transfer Advisory Committee 4 is established within the Department of Transportation. 5"(2) The committee consists of 11 members appointed by the Gov-6 ernor. The members of the committee shall include: 7 "(a) Two members who are transportation engineers; 8 "(b) Two members who represent cities and who have experience 9 working on transportation projects; 10 "(c) One member who represents a county and who has experience 11 working on transportation projects; 12 "(d) One member who represents a regional government and who 13 has experience working on transportation projects; 14 "(e) One member who represents road users; 15"(f) One member who represents law enforcement; 16 "(g) One member who represents transit users; 17 "(h) One member who represents the advisory committee on bicycle 18 traffic established in ORS 366.112; and 19 "(i) One member who represents the Transportation Safety Com-20mittee established in ORS 802.300. 21

"(3) The Governor shall appoint members to the Jurisdictional
 Transfer Advisory Committee so that there is at least one member of
 the committee from each congressional district in this state.

4 "(4) The Jurisdictional Transfer Advisory Committee shall:

6 "(a) Review proposed jurisdictional transfer applications submitted
6 under section 4 of this 2023 Act; and

"(b) Develop a list of three recommended jurisdictional transfers to
submit to the Joint Committee on Transportation before each oddnumbered year session.

"(5) The committee shall actively solicit review and comment from
 the Oregon Transportation Commission in the development of the list.
 The committee shall also shall take into consideration the following:

"(a) The difference between the applicant's and the department's
 standards of maintenance;

15 **"(b) The amount of deferred maintenance;**

16 "(c) A description of how the highway is used in the community;

"(d) The climate impact of a transfer and subsequent upgrades the
 applicant could provide;

"(e) The potential positive impacts on historically underserved
 groups;

"(f) The increase in multimodal transportation options provided by
a transfer; and

23 "(g) A transfer readiness assessment that may include:

²⁴ "(A) The interest of the community;

"(B) Funding capacity of the applicant for the transfer and main tenance in the future; and

"(C) The existing condition of the highway and its current state of
 maintenance.

"(6) No later than September 15 of an even-numbered year, the Ju risdictional Transfer Advisory Committee shall submit a report to the

Joint Committee on Transportation, in the manner provided in ORS
 192.245, that contains a list of three jurisdictional transfers the advi sory committee recommends funding.

"(7) The term of office of each member of the committee is four 4 years, but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. Before $\mathbf{5}$ the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a 6 successor whose term begins on January 1 next following. A member 7 is eligible for reappointment. However, a member of the committee 8 may not serve more than two terms. If there is a vacancy for any 9 cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become imme-10 diately effective for the unexpired term. When a vacancy occurs in an 11 appointment made from a congressional district, the successor shall 12 be appointed from the congressional district for which the vacancy 13 exists. 14

"(8) A majority of the members of the committee constitutes a
 quorum for the transaction of business.

"(9) Official action by the committee requires the approval of a
 majority of the members of the committee.

"(10) The committee shall elect one of its members to serve as
 chairperson.

"(11) The committee shall meet at times and places specified by the
call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the committee, provided that the committee meets at least four times a year.
"(12) The committee may adopt rules necessary for the operation
of the committee.

"(13) The Department of Transportation shall provide assistance
 and space for meetings as requested by the chair of the committee.

"(14) Qualified members, as defined in ORS 292.495, of the advisory
 committee are entitled to compensation for actual and necessary
 travel or other expenses incurred in the performance of their official

duties as specified for qualified members of boards or commissions in
ORS 292.495 (4).

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding the term of office specified by sec tion 1 of this 2023 Act, of the members first appointed by the Governor
 to the Jurisdictional Transfer Advisory Committee:

6 "(1) Two shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2025.

7 "(2) Three shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2026.

8 "(3) Three shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2027.

9 "(4) Three shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2028.

 the department, including but not limited to:

"(a) The Continuous Improvement Advisory Committee established in ORS

28 "<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Department of Transportation shall adopt 29 rules specifying the process by which a city or county may apply for 30 inclusion on the list presented to the Legislative Assembly under sec-

- 1 tion 1 of this 2023 Act.
- "(2) An application must be on a form prescribed by the department
 and must include the following:

4 "(a) The name of the city or county;

5 "(b) A description of the portion of the highway to be transferred;

6 "(c) A desired timeline for the transfer;

7 "(d) The scope of the transfer;

8 "(e) A description of which body assumes liability during and after
9 the transfer;

"(f) The cost to update the segment of highway transferred to a
 state of good repair; and

"(g) Any other information necessary or helpful to the Jurisdic tional Transfer Advisory Committee in making its recommendation to
 the Oregon Transportation Commission.

15 **"(3) An applicant must submit:**

"(a) Plans to provide at least 20 percent of the moneys required for
 the jurisdictional transfer; and

"(b) A community vision plan that describes the applicant's plan for
 managing and improving the road.

20 "<u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate 21 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is 22 declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
