15 **Entrepreneurial Development Loan Fund (ORS 285B.758), Credit En-**
16 **hancement Fund (ORS 285B.215) and Small Business Expansion Loan**
17 **Fund (ORS 285B.133).**

18 **“(b) Special Public Works Fund (ORS 285B.455), Water Fund (ORS**
19 **285B.563), Marine Navigation Improvement Fund (ORS 777.267), Oregon**
20 **Port Revolving Fund (ORS 285A.708), Safe Drinking Water Revolving**
21 **Loan Fund (ORS 285A.213), Brownfields Redevelopment Fund (ORS**
22 **285A.188) and Oregon Brownfield Properties Revitalization Fund (ORS**
23 **285A.198).**

24 **“(2) Debt service, excluding debt service on lottery revenue bonds**
25 **and general obligation bonds.**

26 **“SECTION 11. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate**
27 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
28 **declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect July 1, 2023.”.**
