**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 3395**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “housing” insert “; creating new pro-
2 visions; amending ORS 92.090, 94.550, 100.015, 100.022, 100.105, 100.110,
3 100.115, 197.303, 197.758, 197.830, 215.427, 227.178 and 458.650 and sections 3
4 and 4, chapter 639, Oregon Laws 2019, section 3, chapter 18, Oregon Laws
5 2021, sections 4 and 6, chapter 67, Oregon Laws 2021, and section 23, chapter
6 13, Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled House Bill 2001); repealing section 4, chapter
7 18, Oregon Laws 2021; and declaring an emergency”.

8 Delete lines 4 through 8 and insert:
9

10 **“RESIDENTIAL USE OF COMMERCIAL LANDS**

11
12 **“SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part**
13 **of ORS 197.286 to 197.314.**

14 **“SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding an acknowledged comprehensive**
15 **plan or land use regulations, within an urban growth boundary a local**
16 **government shall allow, on lands zoned to allow only commercial uses**
17 **and not industrial uses, the siting and development of:**

18 **“(a) Residential structures subject to an affordable housing**
19 **covenant as provided in ORS 456.270 to 456.295 making each unit af-**
20 **fordable to a household with income less than or equal to 60 percent**
21 **of the area median income as defined in ORS 456.270; or**

1 **“(b) Mixed use structures with ground floor commercial units and**
2 **residential units subject to an affordable housing covenant as provided**
3 **in ORS 456.270 to 456.295 making the properties affordable to moderate**
4 **income households, as defined in ORS 456.270.**

5 **“(2) The local government may only apply those approval standards,**
6 **conditions and procedures under ORS 197.307, that would be applicable**
7 **to the residential zone of the local government that is most compara-**
8 **ble in density to the allowed commercial uses.**

9 **“(3) Development under this section does not:**

10 **“(a) Trigger any requirement that a local government consider or**
11 **update an analysis as required by a statewide planning goal relating**
12 **to economic development.**

13 **“(b) Apply on lands where the local government determines that:**

14 **“(A) The development on the property cannot be adequately served**
15 **by water, sewer, storm water drainage or streets, or will not be ade-**
16 **quately served at the time that development on the lot is complete;**

17 **“(B) The property contains a slope of 25 percent or greater;**

18 **“(C) The property is within a 100-year floodplain; or**

19 **“(D) The development of the property is constrained by land use**
20 **regulations based on statewide land use planning goals relating to:**

21 **“(i) Natural disasters and hazards; or**

22 **“(ii) Natural resources, including air, water, land or natural areas,**
23 **but not including open spaces.**

24 **“(c) Apply on lands that are vacant or that were added to the urban**
25 **growth boundary within the last 15 years.**

26
27 **“RESIDENTIAL APPROVAL PROCEDURES**

28
29 **“SECTION 3. ORS 215.427 is amended to read:**

30 **“215.427. (1) Except as provided in subsections (3), (5) and (10) of this**

1 section, for land within an urban growth boundary and applications for
2 mineral aggregate extraction, the governing body of a county or its designee
3 shall take final action on an application for a permit, limited land use deci-
4 sion or zone change, including resolution of all appeals under ORS 215.422,
5 within 120 days after the application is deemed complete. The governing body
6 of a county or its designee shall take final action on all other applications
7 for a permit, limited land use decision or zone change, including resolution
8 of all appeals under ORS 215.422, within 150 days after the application is
9 deemed complete, except as provided in subsections (3), (5) and (10) of this
10 section.

11 “(2) If an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone
12 change is incomplete, the governing body or its designee shall notify the
13 applicant in writing of exactly what information is missing within 30 days
14 of receipt of the application and allow the applicant to submit the missing
15 information. The application shall be deemed complete for the purpose of
16 subsection (1) of this section and ORS 197.311 upon receipt by the governing
17 body or its designee of:

18 “(a) All of the missing information;

19 “(b) Some of the missing information and written notice from the appli-
20 cant that no other information will be provided; or

21 “(c) Written notice from the applicant that none of the missing informa-
22 tion will be provided.

23 “(3)(a) If the application was complete when first submitted or the appli-
24 cant submits additional information, as described in subsection (2) of this
25 section, within 180 days of the date the application was first submitted and
26 the county has a comprehensive plan and land use regulations acknowledged
27 under ORS 197.251, approval or denial of the application shall be based upon
28 the standards and criteria that were applicable at the time the application
29 was first submitted.

30 “(b) If the application is for industrial or traded sector development of a

1 site identified under section 12, chapter 800, Oregon Laws 2003, and proposes
2 an amendment to the comprehensive plan, approval or denial of the applica-
3 tion must be based upon the standards and criteria that were applicable at
4 the time the application was first submitted, provided the application com-
5 plies with paragraph (a) of this subsection.

6 “(4) On the 181st day after first being submitted, the application is void
7 if the applicant has been notified of the missing information as required
8 under subsection (2) of this section and has not submitted:

9 “(a) All of the missing information;

10 “(b) Some of the missing information and written notice that no other
11 information will be provided; or

12 “(c) Written notice that none of the missing information will be provided.

13 “(5) The period set in subsection (1) of this section or the 100-day period
14 set in ORS 197.311 may be extended for a specified period of time at the
15 written request of the applicant. The total of all extensions, except as pro-
16 vided in subsection (10) of this section for mediation, may not exceed 215
17 days.

18 “(6) The period set in subsection (1) of this section applies:

19 “(a) Only to decisions wholly within the authority and control of the
20 governing body of the county; and

21 “(b) Unless the parties have agreed to mediation as described in sub-
22 section (10) of this section or ORS 197.319 (2)(b).

23 “(7) Notwithstanding subsection (6) of this section, the period set in sub-
24 section (1) of this section and the 100-day period set in ORS 197.311 do not
25 apply to:

26 “(a) A decision of the county making a change to an acknowledged com-
27 prehensive plan or a land use regulation that is submitted to the Director
28 of the Department of Land Conservation and Development under ORS
29 197.610[.]; **or**

30 “(b) **A decision of a county involving an application for the devel-**

1 **opment of residential structures within an urban growth boundary,**
2 **where the county has tentatively approved the application and extends**
3 **these periods by no more than seven days in order to assure the suf-**
4 **ficiency of its final order.**

5 “(8) Except when an applicant requests an extension under subsection (5)
6 of this section, if the governing body of the county or its designee does not
7 take final action on an application for a permit, limited land use decision
8 or zone change within 120 days or 150 days, as applicable, after the applica-
9 tion is deemed complete, the county shall refund to the applicant either the
10 unexpended portion of any application fees or deposits previously paid or 50
11 percent of the total amount of such fees or deposits, whichever is greater.
12 The applicant is not liable for additional governmental fees incurred subse-
13 quent to the payment of such fees or deposits. However, the applicant is re-
14 sponsible for the costs of providing sufficient additional information to
15 address relevant issues identified in the consideration of the application.

16 “(9) A county may not compel an applicant to waive the period set in
17 subsection (1) of this section or to waive the provisions of subsection (8) of
18 this section or ORS 197.311 or 215.429 as a condition for taking any action
19 on an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone change ex-
20 cept when such applications are filed concurrently and considered jointly
21 with a plan amendment.

22 “(10) The periods set forth in subsections (1) and (5) of this section and
23 ORS 197.311 may be extended by up to 90 additional days, if the applicant
24 and the county agree that a dispute concerning the application will be me-
25 diated.

26 **“SECTION 4.** ORS 227.178 is amended to read:

27 “227.178. (1) Except as provided in subsections (3), (5) and (11) of this
28 section, the governing body of a city or its designee shall take final action
29 on an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone change,
30 including resolution of all appeals under ORS 227.180, within 120 days after

1 the application is deemed complete.

2 “(2) If an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone
3 change is incomplete, the governing body or its designee shall notify the
4 applicant in writing of exactly what information is missing within 30 days
5 of receipt of the application and allow the applicant to submit the missing
6 information. The application shall be deemed complete for the purpose of
7 subsection (1) of this section or ORS 197.311 upon receipt by the governing
8 body or its designee of:

9 “(a) All of the missing information;

10 “(b) Some of the missing information and written notice from the appli-
11 cant that no other information will be provided; or

12 “(c) Written notice from the applicant that none of the missing informa-
13 tion will be provided.

14 “(3)(a) If the application was complete when first submitted or the appli-
15 cant submits the requested additional information within 180 days of the date
16 the application was first submitted and the city has a comprehensive plan
17 and land use regulations acknowledged under ORS 197.251, approval or de-
18 nial of the application shall be based upon the standards and criteria that
19 were applicable at the time the application was first submitted.

20 “(b) If the application is for industrial or traded sector development of a
21 site identified under section 12, chapter 800, Oregon Laws 2003, and proposes
22 an amendment to the comprehensive plan, approval or denial of the applica-
23 tion must be based upon the standards and criteria that were applicable at
24 the time the application was first submitted, provided the application com-
25 plies with paragraph (a) of this subsection.

26 “(4) On the 181st day after first being submitted, the application is void
27 if the applicant has been notified of the missing information as required
28 under subsection (2) of this section and has not submitted:

29 “(a) All of the missing information;

30 “(b) Some of the missing information and written notice that no other

1 information will be provided; or

2 “(c) Written notice that none of the missing information will be provided.

3 “(5) The 120-day period set in subsection (1) of this section or the 100-day
4 period set in ORS 197.311 may be extended for a specified period of time at
5 the written request of the applicant. The total of all extensions, except as
6 provided in subsection (11) of this section for mediation, may not exceed 245
7 days.

8 “(6) The 120-day period set in subsection (1) of this section applies:

9 “(a) Only to decisions wholly within the authority and control of the
10 governing body of the city; and

11 “(b) Unless the parties have agreed to mediation as described in sub-
12 section (11) of this section or ORS 197.319 (2)(b).

13 “(7) Notwithstanding subsection (6) of this section, the 120-day period set
14 in subsection (1) of this section and the 100-day period set in ORS 197.311
15 do not apply to:

16 “(a) A decision of the city making a change to an acknowledged com-
17 prehensive plan or a land use regulation that is submitted to the Director
18 of the Department of Land Conservation and Development under ORS
19 197.610[.]; or

20 “(b) **A decision of a city involving an application for the develop-**
21 **ment of residential structures within an urban growth boundary,**
22 **where the city has tentatively approved the application and extends**
23 **these periods by no more than seven days in order to assure the suf-**
24 **ficiency of its final order.**

25 “(8) Except when an applicant requests an extension under subsection (5)
26 of this section, if the governing body of the city or its designee does not take
27 final action on an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone
28 change within 120 days after the application is deemed complete, the city
29 shall refund to the applicant, subject to the provisions of subsection (9) of
30 this section, either the unexpended portion of any application fees or depos-

1 its previously paid or 50 percent of the total amount of such fees or deposits,
2 whichever is greater. The applicant is not liable for additional governmental
3 fees incurred subsequent to the payment of such fees or deposits. However,
4 the applicant is responsible for the costs of providing sufficient additional
5 information to address relevant issues identified in the consideration of the
6 application.

7 “(9)(a) To obtain a refund under subsection (8) of this section, the appli-
8 cant may either:

9 “(A) Submit a written request for payment, either by mail or in person,
10 to the city or its designee; or

11 “(B) Include the amount claimed in a mandamus petition filed under ORS
12 227.179. The court shall award an amount owed under this section in its final
13 order on the petition.

14 “(b) Within seven calendar days of receiving a request for a refund, the
15 city or its designee shall determine the amount of any refund owed. Payment,
16 or notice that no payment is due, shall be made to the applicant within 30
17 calendar days of receiving the request. Any amount due and not paid within
18 30 calendar days of receipt of the request shall be subject to interest charges
19 at the rate of one percent per month, or a portion thereof.

20 “(c) If payment due under paragraph (b) of this subsection is not paid
21 within 120 days after the city or its designee receives the refund request, the
22 applicant may file an action for recovery of the unpaid refund. In an action
23 brought by a person under this paragraph, the court shall award to a pre-
24 vailing applicant, in addition to the relief provided in this section, reason-
25 able attorney fees and costs at trial and on appeal. If the city or its designee
26 prevails, the court shall award reasonable attorney fees and costs at trial
27 and on appeal if the court finds the petition to be frivolous.

28 “(10) A city may not compel an applicant to waive the 120-day period set
29 in subsection (1) of this section or to waive the provisions of subsection (8)
30 of this section or ORS 197.311 or 227.179 as a condition for taking any action

1 on an application for a permit, limited land use decision or zone change ex-
2 cept when such applications are filed concurrently and considered jointly
3 with a plan amendment.

4 “(11) The periods set forth in subsections (1) and (5) of this section and
5 ORS 197.311 may be extended by up to 90 additional days, if the applicant
6 and the city agree that a dispute concerning the application will be medi-
7 ated.

8 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 197.830 is amended to read:

9 “197.830. (1) Review of land use decisions or limited land use decisions
10 under ORS 197.830 to 197.845 shall be commenced by filing a notice of intent
11 to appeal with the Land Use Board of Appeals.

12 “(2) Except as provided in ORS 197.620, a person may petition the board
13 for review of a land use decision or limited land use decision if the person:

14 “(a) Filed a notice of intent to appeal the decision as provided in sub-
15 section (1) of this section; and

16 “(b) Appeared before the local government, special district or state agency
17 orally or in writing.

18 “(3) If a local government makes a land use decision without providing
19 a hearing, except as provided under ORS 215.416 (11) or 227.175 (10), or the
20 local government makes a land use decision that is different from the pro-
21 posal described in the notice of hearing to such a degree that the notice of
22 the proposed action did not reasonably describe the local government’s final
23 actions, a person adversely affected by the decision may appeal the decision
24 to the board under this section:

25 “(a) Within 21 days of actual notice where notice is required; or

26 “(b) Within 21 days of the date a person knew or should have known of
27 the decision where no notice is required.

28 “(4) If a local government makes a land use decision without a hearing
29 pursuant to ORS 215.416 (11) or 227.175 (10):

30 “(a) A person who was not provided notice of the decision as required

1 under ORS 215.416 (11)(c) or 227.175 (10)(c) may appeal the decision to the
2 board under this section within 21 days of receiving actual notice of the
3 decision.

4 “(b) A person who is not entitled to notice under ORS 215.416 (11)(c) or
5 227.175 (10)(c) but who is adversely affected or aggrieved by the decision may
6 appeal the decision to the board under this section within 21 days after the
7 expiration of the period for filing a local appeal of the decision established
8 by the local government under ORS 215.416 (11)(a) or 227.175 (10)(a).

9 “(c) A person who receives notice of a decision made without a hearing
10 under ORS 215.416 (11) or 227.175 (10) may appeal the decision to the board
11 under this section within 21 days of receiving actual notice of the nature of
12 the decision, if the notice of the decision did not reasonably describe the
13 nature of the decision.

14 “(d) Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, a person who
15 receives notice of a decision made without a hearing under ORS 215.416 (11)
16 or 227.175 (10) may not appeal the decision to the board under this section.

17 “(5) If a local government makes a limited land use decision which is
18 different from the proposal described in the notice to such a degree that the
19 notice of the proposed action did not reasonably describe the local
20 government’s final actions, a person adversely affected by the decision may
21 appeal the decision to the board under this section:

22 “(a) Within 21 days of actual notice where notice is required; or

23 “(b) Within 21 days of the date a person knew or should have known of
24 the decision where no notice is required.

25 “(6) The appeal periods described in subsections (3), (4) and (5) of this
26 section:

27 “(a) May not exceed three years after the date of the decision, except as
28 provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection.

29 “(b) May not exceed 10 years after the date of the decision if notice of a
30 hearing or an administrative decision made pursuant to ORS 197.195 or

1 197.797 is required but has not been provided.

2 “(7)(a) Within 21 days after a notice of intent to appeal has been filed
3 with the board under subsection (1) of this section, any person described in
4 paragraph (b) of this subsection may intervene in and be made a party to the
5 review proceeding by filing a motion to intervene and by paying a filing fee
6 of \$100.

7 “(b) Persons who may intervene in and be made a party to the review
8 proceedings, as set forth in subsection (1) of this section, are:

9 “(A) The applicant who initiated the action before the local government,
10 special district or state agency; or

11 “(B) Persons who appeared before the local government, special district
12 or state agency, orally or in writing.

13 “(c) Failure to comply with the deadline or to pay the filing fee set forth
14 in paragraph (a) of this subsection shall result in denial of a motion to in-
15 tervene.

16 “(8) If a state agency whose order, rule, ruling, policy or other action is
17 at issue is not a party to the proceeding, it may file a brief with the board
18 as if it were a party. The brief shall be due on the same date the respondent’s
19 brief is due and shall be accompanied by a filing fee of \$100.

20 “(9) A notice of intent to appeal a land use decision or limited land use
21 decision shall be filed not later than 21 days after the date the decision
22 sought to be reviewed becomes final. A notice of intent to appeal plan and
23 land use regulation amendments processed pursuant to ORS 197.610 to
24 197.625 shall be filed not later than 21 days after notice of the decision
25 sought to be reviewed is mailed or otherwise submitted to parties entitled
26 to notice under ORS 197.615. Failure to include a statement identifying when,
27 how and to whom notice was provided under ORS 197.615 does not render the
28 notice defective. Copies of the notice of intent to appeal shall be served upon
29 the local government, special district or state agency and the applicant of
30 record, if any, in the local government, special district or state agency pro-

1 ceeding. The notice shall be served and filed in the form and manner pre-
2 scribed by rule of the board and shall be accompanied by a filing fee of \$300.
3 If a petition for review is not filed with the board as required in subsections
4 (10) and (11) of this section, the board shall award the filing fee to the local
5 government, special district or state agency.

6 “(10)(a) Within 21 days after service of the notice of intent to appeal, the
7 local government, special district or state agency shall transmit to the board
8 the original or a certified copy of the entire record of the proceeding under
9 review. By stipulation of all parties to the review proceeding the record may
10 be shortened. The board may require or permit subsequent corrections to the
11 record; however, the board shall issue an order on a motion objecting to the
12 record within 60 days of receiving the motion. If the board denies a
13 petitioner’s objection to the record, the board may establish a new deadline
14 for the petition for review to be filed that may not be less than 14 days from
15 the later of the original deadline for the brief or the date of denial of the
16 petitioner’s record objection.

17 “(b) Within 10 days after service of a notice of intent to appeal, the board
18 shall provide notice to the petitioner and the respondent of their option to
19 enter into mediation pursuant to ORS 197.860. Any person moving to inter-
20 vene shall be provided such notice within seven days after a motion to in-
21 tervene is filed. The notice required by this paragraph shall be accompanied
22 by a statement that mediation information or assistance may be obtained
23 from the Department of Land Conservation and Development.

24 “(11) A petition for review of the land use decision or limited land use
25 decision and supporting brief shall be filed with the board as required by the
26 board under subsection (13) of this section.

27 “(12) The petition shall include a copy of the decision sought to be re-
28 viewed and shall state:

29 “(a) The facts that establish that the petitioner has standing.

30 “(b) The date of the decision.

1 “(c) The issues the petitioner seeks to have reviewed.

2 “(13)(a) The board shall adopt rules establishing deadlines for filing pe-
3 titions and briefs and for oral argument.

4 “(b) **The local government or state agency may withdraw its deci-**
5 **sion for purposes of reconsideration** at any time:

6 “(A) Subsequent to the filing of a notice of intent; and

7 “(B) Prior to:

8 “(i) The date set for filing the record[,]; or[,]

9 “(ii) On appeal of a decision under ORS 197.610 to 197.625 **or relating**
10 **to the development of a residential structure**, [*prior to*] the filing of the
11 respondent’s brief[, *the local government or state agency may withdraw its*
12 *decision for purposes of reconsideration*].

13 “(c) If a local government or state agency withdraws an order for pur-
14 poses of reconsideration, it shall, within such time as the board may allow,
15 affirm, modify or reverse its decision. If the petitioner is dissatisfied with the
16 local government or agency action after withdrawal for purposes of recon-
17 sideration, the petitioner may refile the notice of intent and the review shall
18 proceed upon the revised order. An amended notice of intent is not required
19 if the local government or state agency, on reconsideration, affirms the order
20 or modifies the order with only minor changes.

21 “(14) The board shall issue a final order within 77 days after the date of
22 transmittal of the record. If the order is not issued within 77 days the ap-
23 plicant may apply in Marion County or the circuit court of the county where
24 the application was filed for a writ of mandamus to compel the board to issue
25 a final order.

26 “(15) Upon entry of its final order, the board:

27 “(a) May, in its discretion, award costs to the prevailing party including
28 the cost of preparation of the record if the prevailing party is the local
29 government, special district or state agency whose decision is under review.

30 “(b) Shall award reasonable attorney fees and expenses to the prevailing

1 party against any other party who the board finds presented a position or
2 filed any motion without probable cause to believe the position or motion
3 was well-founded in law or on factually supported information.

4 “(c) Shall award costs and attorney fees to a party as provided in ORS
5 197.843.

6 “(16) Orders issued under this section may be enforced in appropriate ju-
7 dicial proceedings.

8 “(17)(a) The board shall provide for the publication of its orders that are
9 of general public interest in the form it deems best adapted for public con-
10 venience. The publications shall constitute the official reports of the board.

11 “(b) Any moneys collected or received from sales by the board shall be
12 paid into the Board Publications Account established by ORS 197.832.

13 “(18) Except for any sums collected for publication of board opinions, all
14 fees collected by the board under this section that are not awarded as costs
15 shall be paid over to the State Treasurer to be credited to the General Fund.

16 “(19) The board shall track and report on its website:

17 “(a) The number of reviews commenced, as described in subsection (1) of
18 this section, the number of reviews commenced for which a petition is filed
19 under subsection (2) of this section and, in relation to each of those numbers,
20 the rate at which the reviews result in a decision of the board to uphold,
21 reverse or remand the land use decision or limited land use decision. The
22 board shall track and report reviews under this paragraph in categories es-
23 tablished by the board.

24 “(b) A list of petitioners, the number of reviews commenced and the rate
25 at which the petitioner’s reviews have resulted in decisions of the board to
26 uphold, reverse or remand the land use decision or limited land use decision.

27 “(c) A list of respondents, the number of reviews involving each respond-
28 ent and the rate at which reviews involving the respondent have resulted in
29 decisions of the board to uphold, reverse or remand the land use decision or
30 limited land use decision. Additionally, when a respondent is the local gov-

1 ernment that made the land use decision or limited land use decision, the
2 board shall track whether the local government appears before the board.

3 “(d) A list of reviews, and a brief summary of the circumstances in each
4 review, under which the board exercises its discretion to require a losing
5 party to pay the attorney fees of the prevailing party.

“EMERGENCY SHELTER SITING

8

9 “**SECTION 6. Section 4, chapter 18, Oregon Laws 2021, as amended**
10 **by section 3, chapter 47, Oregon Laws 2022, is repealed.**

11 “**SECTION 7.** Section 3, chapter 18, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to
12 read:

13 “**Sec. 3.** (1) A local government shall approve an application for the de-
14 velopment or use of land for an emergency shelter, as defined in [*section 2*
15 *of this 2021 Act*] **ORS 197.782**, on any property, notwithstanding **this chap-**
16 **ter or** ORS chapter 195, [197,] 197A, 215 or 227 or any statewide [*plan*] **land**
17 **use planning goal**, rule of the Land Conservation and Development Com-
18 mission or local land use regulation, zoning ordinance, regional framework
19 plan, functional plan or comprehensive plan, if the emergency shelter:

20 “(a) Includes sleeping and restroom facilities for clients;

21 “(b) Will comply with applicable building codes;

22 “(c) Is located inside an urban growth boundary or in an area zoned for
23 rural residential use as defined in ORS 215.501;

24 “(d) Will not result in the development of a new building that is sited
25 within an area designated under a statewide planning goal relating to na-
26 tural disasters and hazards, including flood plains or mapped environmental
27 health hazards, unless the development complies with regulations directly
28 related to the hazard;

29 “(e) Has adequate transportation access to commercial and medical ser-
30 vices; and

1 “(f) Will not pose any unreasonable risk to public health or safety.

2 “(2) An emergency shelter allowed under this section must be operated
3 by:

4 “(a) A local government as defined in ORS 174.116;

5 “(b) An organization with at least two years’ experience operating an
6 emergency shelter using best practices that is:

7 “(A) A local housing authority as defined in ORS 456.375;

8 “(B) A religious corporation as defined in ORS 65.001; or

9 “(C) A public benefit corporation, as defined in ORS 65.001, whose chari-
10 table purpose includes the support of homeless individuals, that has been
11 recognized as exempt from income tax under section 501(a) of the Internal
12 Revenue Code [*on or before January 1, 2018*] **for at least three years before**
13 **the date of the application for a shelter**; or

14 “(c) A nonprofit corporation partnering with any other entity described
15 in this subsection.

16 “(3) An emergency shelter approved under this section:

17 “(a) May provide on-site for its clients and at no cost to the clients:

18 “(A) Showering or bathing;

19 “(B) Storage for personal property;

20 “(C) Laundry facilities;

21 “(D) Service of food prepared on-site or off-site;

22 “(E) Recreation areas for children and pets;

23 “(F) Case management services for housing, financial, vocational, educa-
24 tional or physical or behavioral health care services; or

25 “(G) Any other services incidental to shelter.

26 “(b) May include youth shelters, winter or warming shelters, day shelters
27 and family violence shelter homes as defined in ORS 409.290.

28 “(4) An emergency shelter approved under this section may also provide
29 additional services not described in subsection (3) of this section to individ-
30 uals who are transitioning from unsheltered homeless status. An organiza-

1 tion providing services under this subsection may charge a fee of no more
2 than \$300 per month per client and only to clients who are financially able
3 to pay the fee and who request the services.

4 “(5)(a) The approval **or denial** of an emergency shelter under this section
5 **may be made without a hearing. Whether or not a hearing is held, the**
6 **approval or denial** is not a land use decision and is subject to review only
7 under ORS 34.010 to 34.100.

8 “(b) A reviewing court shall award attorney fees to:

9 “(A) A local government, and any intervening applicant, that pre-
10 **vails on the appeal of a local government’s approval; and**

11 “(B) An applicant that prevails on an appeal of a local government’s
12 **denial.**

13 “(6) An application for an emergency shelter is not subject to ap-
14 **proval under this section if, at the time of filing, the most recently**
15 **completed point-in-time count, as reported to the United States De-**
16 **partment of Housing and Urban Development under 24 C.F.R. part 578,**
17 **indicated that the total sheltered and unsheltered homeless population**
18 **was less than 0.18 percent of the state population, based on the latest**
19 **estimate from the Portland State University Population Research**
20 **Center.**

21

22 “SINGLE EXIT MULTIFAMILY DWELLINGS

23

24 “SECTION 8. On or before October 1, 2025, the Department of Con-
25 **sumer and Business Services shall review and consider updates to the**
26 **State of Oregon Structural Specialty Code through the Building Codes**
27 **Structures Board established under ORS 455.132, to allow a residential**
28 **occupancy to be served by a single exit, consistent with the following**
29 **policies of this state:**

30 “(1) The reduction, to the extent practicable, of costs and barriers

1 to the construction of midsize multifamily dwellings, including those
2 offering family-size housing with sprinklers on smaller lots, while
3 maintaining safety, public health and the general welfare with respect
4 to construction and occupancy.

5 “(2) Encouraging a variety of less expensive housing types that al-
6 low single-exit residential buildings under certain circumstances con-
7 sistent with other adopted building codes.

8 “(3) In adopting or considering updates to the building code under
9 this section, the department shall consider regional variation in
10 firefighting capacity and equipment and may make amendments to the
11 code contingent upon a certification by a local fire official that the
12 municipality has sufficient firefighting capacity and equipment.

13

14 **“PLANNED COMMUNITY ACT EXEMPTIONS**

15

16 **“SECTION 9.** ORS 94.550 is amended to read:

17 “94.550. As used in ORS 94.550 to 94.783:

18 “(1) ‘Assessment’ means any charge imposed or levied by a homeowners
19 association on or against an owner or lot pursuant to the provisions of the
20 declaration or the bylaws of the planned community or provisions of ORS
21 94.550 to 94.783.

22 “(2) ‘Blanket encumbrance’ means a trust deed or mortgage or any other
23 lien or encumbrance, mechanic’s lien or otherwise, securing or evidencing
24 the payment of money and affecting more than one lot in a planned commu-
25 nity, or an agreement affecting more than one lot by which the developer
26 holds such planned community under an option, contract to sell or trust
27 agreement.

28 “(3) ‘Class I planned community’ means a planned community that:

29 “(a) Contains at least 13 lots or in which the declarant has reserved the
30 right to increase the total number of lots beyond 12; and

1 “(b) Has an estimated annual assessment, including an amount required
2 for reserves under ORS 94.595, exceeding \$10,000 for all lots or \$100 per lot
3 based on:

4 “(A) For a planned community created on or after January 1, 2002, the
5 initial estimated annual assessment, including a constructive assessment
6 based on a subsidy of the association through a contribution of funds, goods
7 or services by the declarant; or

8 “(B) For a planned community created before January 1, 2002, a reason-
9 able estimate of the cost of fulfilling existing obligations imposed by the
10 declaration, bylaws or other governing document as of January 1, 2002.

11 “(4) ‘Class II planned community’ means a planned community that:

12 “(a) Is not a Class I planned community;

13 “(b) Contains at least five lots; and

14 “(c) Has an estimated annual assessment exceeding \$1,000 for all lots
15 based on:

16 “(A) For a planned community created on or after January 1, 2002, the
17 initial estimated annual assessment, including a constructive assessment
18 based on a subsidy of the association through a contribution of funds, goods
19 or services by the declarant; or

20 “(B) For a planned community created before January 1, 2002, a reason-
21 able estimate of the cost of fulfilling existing obligations imposed by the
22 declaration, bylaws or other governing document as of January 1, 2002.

23 “(5) ‘Class III planned community’ means a planned community that is
24 not a Class I or II planned community.

25 “(6) ‘Common expenses’ means expenditures made by or financial liabil-
26 ities incurred by the homeowners association and includes any allocations
27 to the reserve account under ORS 94.595.

28 “(7) ‘Common property’ means any real property or interest in real prop-
29 erty within a planned community which is owned, held or leased by the
30 homeowners association or owned as tenants in common by the lot owners,

1 or designated in the declaration or the plat for transfer to the association.

2 “(8) ‘Condominium’ means property submitted to the provisions of ORS
3 chapter 100.

4 “(9) ‘Declarant’ means any person who creates a planned community un-
5 der ORS 94.550 to 94.783.

6 “(10) ‘Declarant control’ means any special declarant right relating to
7 administrative control of a homeowners association, including but not lim-
8 ited to:

9 “(a) The right of the declarant or person designated by the declarant to
10 appoint or remove an officer or a member of the board of directors;

11 “(b) Any weighted vote or special voting right granted to a declarant or
12 to units owned by the declarant so that the declarant will hold a majority
13 of the voting rights in the association by virtue of such weighted vote or
14 special voting right; and

15 “(c) The right of the declarant to exercise powers and responsibilities
16 otherwise assigned by the declaration or bylaws or by the provisions of ORS
17 94.550 to 94.783 to the association, officers of the association or board of di-
18 rectors of the association.

19 “(11) ‘Declaration’ means the instrument described in ORS 94.580 which
20 establishes a planned community, and any amendments to the instrument.

21 “(12) ‘Electric vehicle charging station’ or ‘charging station’ means a fa-
22 cility designed to deliver electrical current for the purpose of charging one
23 or more electric motor vehicles.

24 “(13) ‘Electronic meeting’ means a meeting that is conducted through
25 telephone, teleconference, video conference, web conference or any other live
26 electronic means where at least one participant is not physically present.

27 “(14) ‘Governing document’ means articles of incorporation, bylaws, a
28 declaration or a rule, regulation or resolution that was properly adopted by
29 the homeowners association or any other instrument or plat relating to
30 common ownership or common maintenance of a portion of a planned com-

1 munity that is binding upon lots within the planned community.

2 “(15) ‘Governing entity’ means an incorporated or unincorporated associ-
3 ation, committee, person or any other entity that has authority under a
4 governing document to maintain commonly maintained property, to impose
5 assessments on lots or to act on matters of common concern on behalf of lot
6 owners within the planned community.

7 “(16) ‘Homeowners association’ or ‘association’ means the organization
8 of owners of lots in a planned community, created under ORS 94.625, required
9 by a governing document or formed under ORS 94.574.

10 “(17) ‘Majority’ or ‘majority of votes’ or ‘majority of owners’ means more
11 than 50 percent of the votes in the planned community.

12 “(18) ‘Mortgagee’ means any person who is:

13 “(a) A mortgagee under a mortgage;

14 “(b) A beneficiary under a trust deed; or

15 “(c) The vendor under a land sale contract.

16 “(19) ‘Owner’ means the owner of any lot in a planned community, unless
17 otherwise specified, but does not include a person holding only a security
18 interest in a lot.

19 “(20) ‘Percent of owners’ or ‘percentage of owners’ means the owners re-
20 presenting the specified voting rights as determined under ORS 94.658.

21 “(21)(a) ‘Planned community’ means any subdivision under ORS 92.010 to
22 92.192 that results in a pattern of ownership of real property and all the
23 buildings, improvements and rights located on or belonging to the real
24 property, in which the owners collectively are responsible for the mainte-
25 nance, operation, insurance or other expenses relating to any property within
26 the planned community, including common property, if any, or for the exte-
27 rior maintenance of any property that is individually owned.

28 “(b) ‘Planned community’ does not mean:

29 “(A) A condominium under ORS chapter 100;

30 “(B) A subdivision that is exclusively commercial or industrial; [or]

1 “(C) A timeshare plan under ORS 94.803 to 94.945[.]; or

2 **“(D) A development established on or after January 1, 2024, in**
3 **which each residential unit is either:**

4 **“(i) Subject to an affordability restriction, including an affordable**
5 **housing covenant, as defined in ORS 456.270; or**

6 **“(ii) Owned by a public benefit or religious nonprofit corporation.**

7 “(22) ‘Purchaser’ means any person other than a declarant who, by means
8 of a voluntary transfer, acquires a legal or equitable interest in a lot, other
9 than as security for an obligation.

10 “(23) ‘Purchaser for resale’ means any person who purchases from the
11 declarant more than two lots for the purpose of resale whether or not the
12 purchaser for resale makes improvements to the lots before reselling them.

13 “(24) ‘Recorded declaration’ means an instrument recorded with the re-
14 cording officer of the county in which the planned community is located that
15 contains covenants, conditions and restrictions that are binding upon lots in
16 the planned community or that impose servitudes on the real property.

17 “(25) ‘Special declarant rights’ means any rights, in addition to the rights
18 of the declarant as a lot owner, reserved for the benefit of the declarant
19 under the declaration or ORS 94.550 to 94.783, including but not limited to:

20 “(a) Constructing or completing construction of improvements in the
21 planned community which are described in the declaration;

22 “(b) Expanding the planned community or withdrawing property from the
23 planned community under ORS 94.580 (3) and (4);

24 “(c) Converting lots into common property;

25 “(d) Making the planned community subject to a master association under
26 ORS 94.695; or

27 “(e) Exercising any right of declarant control reserved under ORS 94.600.

28 “(26) ‘Successor declarant’ means the transferee of any special declarant
29 right.

30 “(27) ‘Turn over’ means the act of turning over administrative responsi-

1 bility pursuant to ORS 94.609 and 94.616.

2 “(28) ‘Unit’ means a building or portion of a building located upon a lot
3 in a planned community and designated for separate occupancy or ownership,
4 but does not include any building or portion of a building located on common
5 property.

6 “(29) ‘Votes’ means the votes allocated to lots in the declaration under
7 ORS 94.580 (2).

8

9 **“REGULATION OF CONDOMINIUMS**

10

11 **“SECTION 10.** ORS 100.015 is amended to read:

12 “100.015. The Real Estate Commissioner **has the exclusive right to**
13 **regulate the submission of property to the provisions of this chapter**
14 **and** may adopt such rules as are necessary for the administration of this
15 chapter.

16 **“SECTION 11.** ORS 100.022 is amended to read:

17 “100.022. [(1)] **Except as provided under ORS 100.015 or explicitly re-**
18 **quired or allowed under this chapter,** a zoning, subdivision, building code
19 or other [*real property law,*] **regulation by a public body, agency rule or**
20 **local ordinance or regulation may not [*prohibit*]:**

21 **“(1) Have the effect of prohibiting or restricting** the condominium
22 form of ownership; or

23 **“(2) Impose any restriction or requirement upon a structure, property**
24 or development **that is submitted or** proposed to be submitted to the con-
25 dominium form of ownership under this chapter that it would not impose
26 upon a structure or development under a different form of ownership[.], **in-**
27 **cluding:**

28 **“(a) Any charge, tax or fee;**

29 **“(b) A review or approval process by any person of a declaration,**
30 **bylaw, plat, articles of incorporation, regulation, resolution or any**

1 **other document relating to the condominium or the submission of the**
2 **property or development to the condominium form of ownership;**

3 **“(c) Any additional permitting requirements or conditions of ap-**
4 **proval of the property or development; or**

5 **“(d) Any other requirements.**

6 *“(2) Except as set forth in this section, no provision of this chapter inval-*
7 *idates or modifies any provision of any zoning, subdivision, building code or*
8 *other real property use law, ordinance or regulation.]*

9 *“(3) Subsection (1) of This section does not prohibit any governmental ap-*
10 *proval required under this chapter.]*

11 **“SECTION 12. ORS 100.110 is amended to read:**

12 **“100.110. (1)(a) Before a declaration, supplemental declaration or an**
13 **amendment thereto may be recorded, it must be approved as provided in this**
14 **section by the county assessor of the county in which the property is located**
15 **and the Real Estate Commissioner.**

16 **“(b) Before a declaration, supplemental declaration or, if required under**
17 **subsection (3) of this section, an amendment thereto may be recorded, it must**
18 **be approved by the tax collector of the county in which the property is lo-**
19 **cated.**

20 **“(c) A declaration, supplemental declaration or amendment thereto may**
21 **not be approved unless the requirements of subsections (2) to (7) of this**
22 **section are met. Approval must be evidenced by execution of the declaration**
23 **or amendment or by a written approval attached thereto.**

24 **“(d) If the requirements of subsections (2) to (7) of this section are met,**
25 **the commissioner, county assessor and tax collector, if applicable,[:]**

26 **“(A)] shall approve the declaration, supplemental declaration or**
27 **amendment[; and]**

28 **“(B) May not impose additional requirements not specified in subsections**
29 **(2) to (7) of this section].**

30 **“(2) The county assessor of the county in which the property is located**

1 shall approve a declaration, supplemental declaration or amendment thereto
2 if:

3 “(a) The name complies with ORS 100.105 (5) and (6); and

4 “(b) The plat complies with the requirements of ORS 100.115 or the plat
5 amendment complies with ORS 100.116.

6 “(3) The tax collector of the county in which the property is located shall
7 approve the declaration or supplemental declaration, or an amendment that
8 adds property to the condominium, changes the boundary of a unit or creates
9 an additional unit from all or parts of other units or from all or parts of
10 other units and common elements for which a plat amendment is required
11 under ORS 100.116, if:

12 “(a) All ad valorem taxes, special assessments, fees, or other charges re-
13 quired by law to be placed upon the tax roll for the affected units that have
14 or will become a lien upon the property during the tax year have been paid;

15 “(b) Advance payment of ad valorem taxes, special assessments, fees or
16 other charges for the affected units that are not on the tax roll and for
17 which payment is required under paragraph (a) of this subsection has been
18 made to the tax collector utilizing the procedures contained in ORS 92.095
19 and 311.370; and

20 “(c) The additional taxes, penalty, and any interest attributable thereto,
21 required because of disqualification of the affected units from any special
22 assessment have been paid.

23 “(4) Subject to subsection (6) of this section, the commissioner shall ap-
24 prove the declaration or amendment thereto if:

25 “(a) The declaration or the amendment thereto complies with the re-
26 quirements of ORS 100.105 and 100.135 and other provisions of this chapter;

27 “(b) The bylaws adopted under ORS 100.410 comply with the requirements
28 of ORS 100.410 and 100.415 and other provisions of this chapter;

29 “(c) The plat complies with the requirements of ORS 100.115 or the plat
30 amendment complies with ORS 100.116 and other provisions of this chapter;

1 “(d) The declaration is for a conversion condominium and the declarant
2 has submitted:

3 “(A) An affidavit that the notice of conversion was given in accordance
4 with ORS 100.305 and that the notice period has expired;

5 “(B) An affidavit that the notice of conversion was given in accordance
6 with ORS 100.305 and copies of the written consent of any tenants as pro-
7 vided in ORS 100.305 (6) or a signed statement that no tenants were entitled
8 to notice under ORS 100.305; or

9 “(C) Any applicable combination of the requirements of subparagraphs (A)
10 and (B) of this paragraph;

11 “(e) A copy of the plat executed by the declarant and prepared in con-
12 formance with ORS 100.115 or plat amendment prepared in conformance with
13 ORS 100.116 is submitted;

14 “(f) A certification of plat execution, on a form prescribed and furnished
15 by the commissioner, is:

16 “(A) Executed by the declarant, the professional land surveyor who signed
17 the surveyor’s certificate on the plat, the attorney for the declarant, a rep-
18 resentative of the title insurance company that issued the information re-
19 quired under ORS 100.640 (1)(e) or 100.668 (2)(d) or another person authorized
20 by the declarant in writing to execute the certification; and

21 “(B) Submitted stating that the copy is a true copy of the plat signed by
22 the declarant; and

23 “(g) A copy of a reserve study has been submitted, if a disclosure state-
24 ment was issued under ORS 100.655 and the reserve study was not included
25 pursuant to ORS 100.640 (1)(g).

26 “(5) The commissioner shall approve a supplemental declaration if:

27 “(a) The supplemental declaration complies with the requirements of ORS
28 100.120 and other provisions of this chapter;

29 “(b) The supplemental plat complies with the requirements of ORS
30 100.115;

1 “(c) The supplemental declaration is for a conversion condominium and
2 the declarant has complied with the requirements of subsection (4)(d) of this
3 section; and

4 “(d) A copy of the supplemental plat and a certification of plat execution
5 described in subsection (4)(e) and (f) of this section have been submitted.

6 “(6) Approval by the commissioner is not required for an amendment to
7 a declaration transferring the right of use of a limited common element
8 pursuant to ORS 100.515 (5).

9 “(7) Before the commissioner approves the declaration, supplemental dec-
10 laration or amendment thereto under this section:

11 “(a) The declarant or other person requesting approval shall pay to the
12 commissioner a fee determined by the commissioner under ORS 100.670; and

13 “(b) For an amendment or supplemental declaration, the Condominium
14 Information Report and the Annual Report described in ORS 100.260 must
15 be designated current by the Real Estate Agency as provided in ORS 100.255
16 and the fee required under ORS 100.670 must be paid.

17 “(8) If the declaration, supplemental declaration or amendment thereto
18 approved by the commissioner under subsection (4) or (5) of this section is
19 not recorded in accordance with ORS 100.115 within one year from the date
20 of approval by the commissioner, the approval automatically expires and the
21 declaration, supplemental declaration or amendment thereto must be resub-
22 mitted for approval in accordance with this section. The commissioner’s ap-
23 proval must set forth the date on which the approval expires.

24 “**SECTION 13.** ORS 100.115 is amended to read:

25 “100.115. (1) A plat of the land described in the declaration or a supple-
26 mental plat described in a supplemental declaration, complying with ORS
27 92.050, 92.060 (1) and (2), 92.080 and 92.120, shall be recorded simultaneously
28 with the declaration or supplemental declaration. The plat or supplemental
29 plat shall be titled in accordance with subsection (3) of this section and
30 shall:

1 “(a) Show the location of:

2 “(A) All buildings and public roads. The location shall be referenced to
3 a point on the boundary of the property; and

4 “(B) For a condominium containing units described in ORS 100.020
5 (3)(b)(C) or (D), the moorage space or floating structure. The location shall
6 be referenced to a point on the boundary of the upland property regardless
7 of a change in the location resulting from a fluctuation in the water level
8 or flow.

9 “(b) Show the designation, location, dimensions and area in square feet
10 of each unit including:

11 “(A) For units in a building described in ORS 100.020 (3)(b)(A), the hori-
12 zontal and vertical boundaries of each unit and the common elements to
13 which each unit has access. The vertical boundaries shall be referenced to
14 a known benchmark elevation or other reference point as approved by the
15 city or county surveyor;

16 “(B) For a space described in ORS 100.020 (3)(b)(B), the horizontal
17 boundaries of each unit and the common elements to which each unit has
18 access. If the space is located within a structure, the vertical boundaries also
19 shall be shown and referenced to a known benchmark elevation or other
20 reference point as approved by the city or county surveyor;

21 “(C) For a moorage space described in ORS 100.020 (3)(b)(C), the hori-
22 zontal boundaries of each unit and the common elements to which each unit
23 has access; and

24 “(D) For a floating structure described in ORS 100.020 (3)(b)(D), the hori-
25 zontal and vertical boundaries of each unit and the common elements to
26 which each unit has access. The vertical boundaries shall be referenced to
27 an assumed elevation of an identified point on the floating structure even
28 though the assumed elevation may change with the fluctuation of the water
29 level where the floating structure is moored.

30 “(c) Identify and show, to the extent feasible, the location and dimensions

1 of all limited common elements described in the declaration. The plat may
2 not include any statement indicating to which unit the use of any noncon-
3 tiguous limited common element is reserved.

4 “(d) Include a statement, including signature and official seal, of a regis-
5 tered architect, registered professional land surveyor or registered profes-
6 sional engineer certifying that the plat fully and accurately depicts the
7 boundaries of the units of the building and that construction of the units and
8 buildings as depicted on the plat has been completed, except that the pro-
9 fessional land surveyor who prepared the plat need not affix a seal to the
10 statement.

11 “(e) Include a surveyor’s certificate, complying with ORS 92.070, that in-
12 cludes information in the declaration in accordance with ORS 100.105 (1)(a)
13 and a metes and bounds description or other description approved by the city
14 or county surveyor.

15 “(f) Include a statement by the declarant that the property and improve-
16 ments described and depicted on the plat are subject to the provisions of ORS
17 100.005 to 100.627.

18 “[g] *Include such signatures of approval as may be required by local or-*
19 *dinance or regulation.*]

20 “[h] **(g)** Include any other information or data not inconsistent with the
21 declaration that the declarant desires to include.

22 “[i] **(h)** If the condominium is a flexible condominium, show the location
23 and dimensions of all variable property identified in the declaration and la-
24 bel the variable property as ‘WITHDRAWABLE VARIABLE PROPERTY’ or
25 ‘NONWITHDRAWABLE VARIABLE PROPERTY,’ with a letter different
26 from those designating a unit, building or other tract of variable property.
27 If there is more than one tract, each tract shall be labeled in the same
28 manner.

29 “(2) The supplemental plat required under ORS 100.150 (1) shall be re-
30 corded simultaneously with the supplemental declaration. The supplemental

1 plat shall be titled in accordance with subsection (3) of this section and
2 shall:

3 “(a) Comply with ORS 92.050, 92.060 (1), (2) and (4), 92.080, 92.120 and
4 subsection (3) of this section.

5 “(b) If any property is withdrawn:

6 “(A) Show the resulting perimeter boundaries of the condominium after
7 the withdrawal; and

8 “(B) Show the information required under subsection [(1)(i)] **(1)(h)** of this
9 section as it relates to any remaining variable property.

10 “(c) If any property is reclassified, show the information required under
11 subsection (1)(a) to (d) of this section.

12 “(d) Include a ‘Declarant’s Statement’ that the property described on the
13 supplemental plat is reclassified or withdrawn from the condominium and
14 that the condominium exists as described and depicted on the plat.

15 “(e) Include a surveyor’s certificate complying with ORS 92.070.

16 “(3) The title of each supplemental plat described in ORS 100.120 shall
17 include the complete name of the condominium, followed by the additional
18 language specified in this subsection and the appropriate reference to the
19 stage being annexed or tract of variable property being reclassified. Each
20 supplemental plat for a condominium recorded on or after January 1, 2002,
21 shall be numbered sequentially and shall:

22 “(a) If property is annexed under ORS 100.125, include the words ‘Sup-
23 plemental Plat No. _____: Annexation of Stage _____’; or

24 “(b) If property is reclassified under ORS 100.150, include the words
25 ‘Supplemental Plat No. _____: Reclassification of Variable Property, Tract
26 _____.’

27 “(4) Upon request of the county surveyor or assessor, the person offering
28 a plat or supplemental plat for recording shall also file an exact copy, cer-
29 tified by the surveyor who made the plat to be an exact copy of the plat,
30 with the county assessor and the county surveyor. The exact copy shall be

1 made on suitable drafting material having the characteristics of strength,
2 stability and transparency required by the county surveyor.

3 “(5) Before a plat or a supplemental plat may be recorded, it must be ap-
4 proved by the city or county surveyor as provided in ORS 92.100. Before ap-
5 proving the plat as required by this section, the city or county surveyor
6 shall:

7 “(a) Check the boundaries of the plat and units and take measurements
8 and make computations necessary to determine that the plat complies with
9 this section.

10 “(b) Determine that the name complies with ORS 100.105 (5) and (6).

11 “(c) Determine that the following are consistent:

12 “(A) The designation and area in square feet of each unit shown on the
13 plat and the unit designations and areas contained in the declaration in ac-
14 cordance with ORS 100.105 (1)(d);

15 “(B) Limited common elements identified on the plat and the information
16 contained in the declaration in accordance with ORS 100.105 (1)(h);

17 “(C) The description of the property in the surveyor’s certificate included
18 on the plat and the description contained in the declaration in accordance
19 with ORS 100.105 (1)(a); and

20 “(D) For a flexible condominium, the variable property depicted on the
21 plat and the identification of the property contained in the declaration in
22 accordance with ORS 100.105 (7)(c).

23 “(6) The person offering the plat or supplemental plat for approval shall:

24 “(a) Submit a copy of the proposed declaration and bylaws or applicable
25 supplemental declaration at the time the plat is submitted; and

26 “(b) Submit the original or a copy of the executed declaration and bylaws
27 or the applicable supplemental declaration approved by the commissioner if
28 required by law prior to approval.

29 “(7) For performing the services described in subsection (5)(a) to (c) of
30 this section, the city surveyor or county surveyor shall collect from the

1 person offering the plat for approval a fee of \$150 plus \$25 per building. The
2 governing body of a city or county may establish a higher fee by resolution
3 or order.

4 **“SECTION 14.** ORS 100.105 is amended to read:

5 “100.105. (1) A declaration must contain:

6 “(a) A description of the property, including property on which a unit or
7 a limited common element is located, whether held in fee simple, leasehold,
8 easement or other interest or combination thereof, that is being submitted
9 to the condominium form of ownership and that conforms to the description
10 in the surveyor’s certificate provided under ORS 100.115 (1).

11 “(b) Subject to subsection (11) of this section, a statement of the interest
12 in the property being submitted to the condominium form of ownership,
13 whether fee simple, leasehold, easement or other interest or combination
14 thereof.

15 “(c) Subject to subsections (5) and (6) of this section, the name by which
16 the property is known and a general description of each unit and the build-
17 ing or buildings, including the number of stories and basements of each
18 building, the total number of units and the principal materials of which they
19 are constructed.

20 “(d) The unit designation, a statement that the location of each unit is
21 shown on the plat, a description of the boundaries and area in square feet
22 of each unit and any other data necessary for proper identification. The area
23 of a unit must be the same as shown for that unit on the plat described in
24 ORS 100.115 (1).

25 “(e) A notice in substantially the following form in at least 12-point type
26 in all capitals or boldface:

30 THE SQUARE FOOTAGE AREAS STATED IN THIS DECLARATION

1 AND THE PLAT ARE BASED ON THE BOUNDARIES OF THE UNITS AS

3 AREA OF UNITS CALCULATED FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

4 “ _____

5 “(f) A description of the general common elements.

6 “(g) An allocation to each unit of an undivided interest in the common
7 elements in accordance with ORS 100.515 and the method used to establish
8 the allocation.

9 “(h) The designation of any limited common elements including:

10 “(A) A general statement of the nature of the limited common element;

11 “(B) A statement of the unit to which the use of each limited common
12 element is reserved, provided the statement is not a reference to an assign-
13 ment of use specified on the plat; and

14 “(C) The allocation of use of any limited common element appertaining
15 to more than one unit.

16 “(i) The method of determining liability for common expenses and right
17 to common profits in accordance with ORS 100.530.

18 “(j) The voting rights allocated to each unit in accordance with ORS
19 100.525 or, in the case of condominium units committed as property in a
20 timeshare plan defined in ORS 94.803, the voting rights allocated in the
21 timeshare instrument.

22 “(k) A statement of the general nature of use, residential or otherwise,
23 for which the building or buildings and each of the units is intended.

24 “(L) A statement that the designated agent to receive service of process
25 in cases provided in ORS 100.550 (1) is named in the Condominium Informa-
26 tion Report which will be filed with the Real Estate Agency in accordance
27 with ORS 100.250 (1)(a).

28 “(m) The method of amending the declaration and the percentage of vot-
29 ing rights required to approve an amendment of the declaration in accord-
30 ance with ORS 100.135.

1 “(n) A statement as to whether or not the association of unit owners
2 pursuant to ORS 100.405 (5) and (8) has authority to grant leases, easements,
3 rights of way, licenses and other similar interests affecting the general and
4 limited common elements of the condominium and consent to vacation of
5 roadways within and adjacent to the condominium.

6 “(o) If the condominium contains a floating structure described in ORS
7 100.020 (3), a statement regarding the authority of the board of directors of
8 the association, subject to ORS 100.410, to temporarily relocate the floating
9 structure without a majority vote of affected unit owners.

10 “(p) Any restrictions on alienation of units. Any such restrictions created
11 by documents other than the declaration may be incorporated by reference
12 in the declaration to the official records of the county in which the property
13 is located.

14 “(q) Any other details regarding the property that the person executing
15 the declaration considers desirable. However, if a provision required to be
16 in the bylaws under ORS 100.415 is included in the declaration, the voting
17 requirements for amending the bylaws also govern the amendment of the
18 provision in the declaration.

19 “(2) In the event the declarant proposes to annex additional property to
20 the condominium under ORS 100.125, the declaration also must contain a
21 general description of the plan of development, including:

22 “(a) The maximum number of units to be included in the condominium.

23 “(b) The date after which any right to annex additional property will
24 terminate.

25 “(c) A general description of the nature and proposed use of any addi-
26 tional common elements which declarant proposes to annex to the condo-
27 minium, if such common elements might substantially increase the
28 proportionate amount of the common expenses payable by existing unit
29 owners.

30 “(d) A statement that the method used to establish the allocation of un-

1 divided interest in the common elements, the method used to determine li-
2 ability for common expenses and right to common profits and the method
3 used to allocate voting rights for each unit annexed is as stated in the dec-
4 laration in accordance with subsection (1)(g), (i) and (j) of this section.

5 “(e) Such other information as the Real Estate Commissioner requires in
6 order to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

7 “(3) Unless expressly prohibited by the declaration and subject to the re-
8 quirements of ORS 100.135 (2) and subsections (9) and (10) of this section:

9 “(a) Not later than two years following the termination date specified in
10 subsection (2)(b) of this section, the termination date may be extended for a
11 period not exceeding five years.

12 “(b) Before the termination date specified in the declaration or supple-
13 mental declaration under subsection (7)(d) of this section, the termination
14 date may be extended for a period not exceeding five years.

15 “(c) The general description under subsection (2)(c) of this section and the
16 information included in the declaration or supplemental declaration in ac-
17 cordance with subsection (7)(c), (g) and (h) of this section may be changed
18 by an amendment to the declaration or supplemental declaration and plat
19 or supplemental plat.

20 “(4) The information included in the declaration or supplemental decla-
21 ration in accordance with subsection (2)(a) and (d) of this section and sub-
22 section (7)(a), (b), (e), (f) and (k) of this section may not be changed unless
23 all owners agree to the change and an amendment to the declaration or
24 supplemental declaration and, if applicable, the plat or supplemental plat are
25 recorded in accordance with this chapter.

26 “(5) The name of the property shall include the word ‘condominium’ or
27 ‘condominiums’ or the words ‘a condominium.’

28 “(6) A condominium may not bear a name which is the same as or
29 deceptively similar to the name of any other, **different** condominium located
30 in the same county.

1 “(7) If the condominium is a flexible condominium containing variable
2 property, the declaration shall also contain a general description of the plan
3 of development, including:

4 “(a) A statement that the rights provided for under ORS 100.150 (1) are
5 being reserved.

6 “(b) A statement:

7 “(A) Of any limitations on rights reserved under ORS 100.150 (1), includ-
8 ing whether the consent of any unit owner is required, and if so, a statement
9 of the method by which the consent is ascertained; or

10 “(B) That there are no limitations on rights reserved under ORS 100.150
11 (1).

12 “(c) A statement of the total number of tracts of variable property within
13 the condominium, including:

14 “(A) A designation of each tract as withdrawable variable property or
15 nonwithdrawable variable property;

16 “(B) Identification of each variable tract by a label in accordance with
17 ORS 100.115 [(1)(i)] **(1)(h)**;

18 “(C) A statement of the method of labeling each tract depicted on the plat
19 in accordance with ORS 100.115 [(1)(i)] **(1)(h)**; and

20 “(D) A statement of the total number of tracts of each type of variable
21 property.

22 “(d) The termination date, which is the date after which any right re-
23 served under ORS 100.150 (1) will terminate, and a statement of the circum-
24 stances, if any, that will terminate any right on or before the date specified.
25 Subject to ORS 100.120, the termination date from the date of recording of
26 the conveyance of the first unit in the condominium to a person other than
27 the declarant may not exceed:

28 “(A) Twenty years, only if a condominium consists, or may consist if the
29 condominium is a flexible condominium, exclusively of units to be used for
30 nonresidential purposes; or

1 “(B) Seven years.

2 “(e) The maximum number of units that may be created.

3 “(f) A statement that the method used to establish the allocations of un-
4 divided interest in the common elements, the method used to determine li-
5 ability for common expenses and right to common profits and the method
6 used to allocate voting rights as additional units are created is the same as
7 stated in the declaration in accordance with subsection (1)(g), (i) and (j) of
8 this section.

9 “(g) A general description of all existing improvements and the nature
10 and proposed use of any improvements that may be made on variable prop-
11 erty if the improvements might substantially increase the proportionate
12 amount of the common expenses payable by existing unit owners.

13 “(h) A statement of whether or not the declarant reserves the right to
14 create limited common elements within any variable property, and if so, a
15 general description of the types that may be created.

16 “(i) A statement that the plat shows the location and dimensions of all
17 withdrawable variable property that is labeled ‘WITHDRAWABLE VARI-
18 ABLE PROPERTY.’

19 “(j) A statement that if by the termination date all or a portion of the
20 withdrawable variable property has not been withdrawn or reclassified, the
21 withdrawable variable property is automatically withdrawn from the condo-
22 minium as of the termination date.

23 “(k) A statement of the rights of the association under ORS 100.155 (2).

24 “(L) A statement of whether or not all or any portion of the variable
25 property may not be withdrawn from the condominium and, if so, with re-
26 spect to the nonwithdrawable variable property:

27 “(A) A statement that the plat shows the location and dimensions of all
28 nonwithdrawable variable property that is labeled ‘NONWITHDRAWABLE
29 VARIABLE PROPERTY.’

30 “(B) A description of all improvements that may be made and a statement

1 of the intended use of each improvement.

2 “(C) A statement that, if by the termination date all or a portion of the
3 variable property designated as ‘nonwithdrawable variable property’ has not
4 been reclassified, the property is automatically reclassified as of the termi-
5 nation date as a general common element of the condominium and any in-
6 terest in the property held for security purposes is automatically
7 extinguished by the classification.

8 “(D) A statement of the rights of the association under ORS 100.155 (3).

9 “(m) A statement by the local governing body or appropriate department
10 thereof that the withdrawal of any variable property designated as
11 ‘withdrawable variable property’ in the declaration in accordance with par-
12 agraph (L) of this subsection, will not violate any applicable planning or
13 zoning regulation or ordinance. The statement may be attached as an exhibit
14 to the declaration.

15 “(8) The plan of development for any variable property included in the
16 declaration or any supplemental declaration of any stage in accordance with
17 subsection (7) of this section is subject to any plan of development included
18 in the declaration in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, except
19 that the time limitation specified in subsection (7)(d) of this section governs
20 any right reserved under ORS 100.150 (1) with respect to any variable prop-
21 erty.

22 “(9) The information included in the declaration in accordance with sub-
23 section (7)(j), (k) and (m) of this section may not be deleted by amendment.

24 “(10)(a) Approval by the unit owners is not required for a declarant to
25 redesignate withdrawable variable property as ‘nonwithdrawable variable
26 property’ under ORS 100.150 (1) by supplemental declaration and supple-
27 mental plat, for any reason, including if the redesignation is required by the
28 local governing body to comply with any planning or zoning regulation or
29 ordinance.

30 “(b) If as a result of a redesignation under paragraph (a) of this sub-

1 section, the information required to be included in the supplemental decla-
2 ration under subsection (7)(L)(B) of this section is inconsistent with the
3 information included in the declaration or supplemental declaration in ac-
4 cordance with subsection (7)(g) of this section, an amendment to the decla-
5 ration or supplemental declaration and plat or supplemental plat approved
6 by at least 75 percent of owners is required.

7 “(11) The statement of an interest in property other than fee simple sub-
8 mitted to the condominium form of ownership and any easements, rights or
9 appurtenances belonging to property submitted to the condominium form of
10 ownership, whether leasehold or fee simple, must include:

11 “(a) A reference to the recording index numbers and date of recording of
12 the instrument creating the interest; or

13 “(b) A reference to the law, administrative rule, ordinance or regulation
14 that creates the interest if the interest is created under law, administrative
15 rule, ordinance or regulation and not recorded in the office of the recording
16 officer of the county in which the property is located.

18 **“SUBDIVIDING FOR DEVELOPMENT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING**

19

20 **“SECTION 15.** ORS 92.090 is amended to read:

21 “92.090. (1) Subdivision plat names shall be subject to the approval of the
22 county surveyor or, in the case where there is no county surveyor, the
23 county assessor. No tentative subdivision plan or subdivision plat of a sub-
24 division shall be approved which bears a name similar to or pronounced the
25 same as the name of any other subdivision in the same county, unless the
26 land platted is contiguous to and platted by the same party that platted the
27 subdivision bearing that name or unless the party files and records the con-
28 sent of the party that platted the contiguous subdivision bearing that name.
29 All subdivision plats must continue the lot numbers and, if used, the block
30 numbers of the subdivision plat of the same name last filed. On or after

1 January 1, 1992, any subdivision submitted for final approval shall not use
2 block numbers or letters unless such subdivision is a continued phase of a
3 previously recorded subdivision, bearing the same name, that has previously
4 used block numbers or letters.

5 “(2) No tentative plan for a proposed subdivision and no tentative plan
6 for a proposed partition shall be approved unless:

7 “(a) The streets and roads are laid out so as to conform to the plats of
8 subdivisions and partitions already approved for adjoining property as to
9 width, general direction and in all other respects unless the city or county
10 determines it is in the public interest to modify the street or road pattern.

11 “(b) Streets and roads held for private use are clearly indicated on the
12 tentative plan and all reservations or restrictions relating to such private
13 roads and streets are set forth thereon.

14 “(c) The tentative plan complies with the applicable zoning ordinances
15 and regulations and the ordinances or regulations adopted under ORS 92.044
16 that are then in effect for the city or county within which the land described
17 in the plan is situated.

18 “(3) No plat of a proposed subdivision or partition shall be approved un-
19 less:

20 “(a) Streets and roads for public use are dedicated without any reserva-
21 tion or restriction other than reversionary rights upon vacation of any such
22 street or road and easements for public or private utilities.

23 “(b) Streets and roads held for private use and indicated on the tentative
24 plan of such subdivision or partition have been approved by the city or
25 county.

26 “(c) The subdivision or partition plat complies with any applicable zoning
27 ordinances and regulations and any ordinance or regulation adopted under
28 ORS 92.044 that are then in effect for the city or county within which the
29 land described in the subdivision or partition plat is situated.

30 “(d) The subdivision or partition plat is in substantial conformity with

1 the provisions of the tentative plan for the subdivision or partition, as ap-
2 proved.

3 “(e) The subdivision or partition plat contains a donation to the public
4 of all common improvements, including but not limited to streets, roads,
5 parks, sewage disposal and water supply systems, the donation of which was
6 made a condition of the approval of the tentative plan for the subdivision
7 or partition.

8 “(f) Explanations of all common improvements required as conditions of
9 approval of the tentative plan of the subdivision or partition have been re-
10 corded and referenced on the subdivision or partition plat.

11 “(4) Subject to any standards and procedures adopted pursuant to ORS
12 92.044, no plat of a subdivision shall be approved by a city or county unless
13 the city or county has received and accepted:

14 “(a) A certification by a city-owned domestic water supply system or by
15 the owner of a privately owned domestic water supply system, subject to
16 regulation by the Public Utility Commission of Oregon, that water will be
17 available to the lot line of each and every lot depicted in the proposed sub-
18 division plat;

19 “(b) A bond, irrevocable letter of credit, contract or other assurance by
20 the subdivider to the city or county that a domestic water supply system will
21 be installed by or on behalf of the subdivider to the lot line of each and
22 every lot depicted in the proposed subdivision plat[; *and the amount of any*
23 *such bond, irrevocable letter of credit, contract or other assurance by the sub-*
24 *divider shall be]* **in an amount** determined by a registered professional en-
25 gineer, subject to any change in such amount as determined necessary by the
26 city or county; or

27 “(c) [*In lieu of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection,*] A statement that
28 no domestic water supply facility will be provided to the purchaser of any
29 lot depicted in the proposed subdivision plat, even though a domestic water
30 supply source may exist. A copy of any such statement, signed by the sub-

1 divider and indorsed by the city or county, shall be filed by the subdivider
2 with the Real Estate Commissioner and shall be included by the commis-
3 sioner in any public report made for the subdivision under ORS 92.385. If the
4 making of a public report has been waived or the subdivision is otherwise
5 exempt under the Oregon Subdivision Control Law, the subdivider shall de-
6 liver a copy of the statement to each prospective purchaser of a lot in the
7 subdivision at or prior to the signing by the purchaser of the first written
8 agreement for the sale of the lot. The subdivider shall take a signed receipt
9 from the purchaser upon delivery of such a statement, shall immediately send
10 a copy of the receipt to the commissioner and shall keep any such receipt
11 on file in this state, subject to inspection by the commissioner, for a period
12 of three years after the date the receipt is taken.

13 “(5) Subject to any standards and procedures adopted pursuant to ORS
14 92.044, no plat of a subdivision shall be approved by a city or county unless
15 the city or county has received and accepted:

16 “(a) A certification by a city-owned sewage disposal system or by the
17 owner of a privately owned sewage disposal system that is subject to regu-
18 lation by the Public Utility Commission of Oregon that a sewage disposal
19 system will be available to the lot line of each and every lot depicted in the
20 proposed subdivision plat;

21 “(b) A bond, irrevocable letter of credit, contract or other assurance by
22 the subdivider to the city or county that a sewage disposal system will be
23 installed by or on behalf of the subdivider to the lot line of each and every
24 lot depicted on the proposed subdivision plat[; *and the amount of such bond,*
25 *irrevocable letter of credit, contract or other assurance shall be]* **in an amount**
26 determined by a registered professional engineer, subject to any change in
27 such amount as the city or county considers necessary; or

28 “(c) [*In lieu of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection,*] A statement that
29 no sewage disposal facility will be provided to the purchaser of any lot de-
30 picted in the proposed subdivision plat, where the Department of Environ-

1 mental Quality has approved the proposed method or an alternative method
2 of sewage disposal for the subdivision in its evaluation report described in
3 ORS 454.755 (1)(b). A copy of any such statement, signed by the subdivider
4 and indorsed by the city or county shall be filed by the subdivider with the
5 Real Estate Commissioner and shall be included by the commissioner in the
6 public report made for the subdivision under ORS 92.385. If the making of a
7 public report has been waived or the subdivision is otherwise exempt under
8 the Oregon Subdivision Control Law, the subdivider shall deliver a copy of
9 the statement to each prospective purchaser of a lot in the subdivision at
10 or prior to the signing by the purchaser of the first written agreement for
11 the sale of the lot. The subdivider shall take a signed receipt from the pur-
12 chaser upon delivery of such a statement, shall immediately send a copy of
13 the receipt to the commissioner and shall keep any such receipt on file in
14 this state, subject to inspection by the commissioner, for a period of three
15 years after the date the receipt is taken.

16 **“(6) A city or county shall accept as other assurance, as used in**
17 **subsections (4)(b) and (5)(b) of this section, one or more award letters**
18 **from public funding sources made to a subdivider who is subdividing**
19 **the property to develop affordable housing, that is or will be subject**
20 **to an affordability restriction as defined in ORS 456.250 or an affor-**
21 **able housing covenant as defined in ORS 456.270, if the awards total an**
22 **amount greater than the project cost.**

23 “[~~(6)~~] (7) Subject to any standards and procedures adopted pursuant to
24 ORS 92.044, no plat of a subdivision or partition located within the bounda-
25 ries of an irrigation district, drainage district, water control district, water
26 improvement district or district improvement company shall be approved by
27 a city or county unless the city or county has received and accepted a cer-
28 tification from the district or company that the subdivision or partition is
29 either entirely excluded from the district or company or is included within
30 the district or company for purposes of receiving services and subjecting the

1 subdivision or partition to the fees and other charges of the district or
2 company.

4 **“SINGLE ROOM OCCUPANCIES**

5
6 **“SECTION 16. Section 17 of this 2023 Act and ORS 197.758 are added**
7 **to and made a part of ORS 197.286 to 197.314.**

8 **“SECTION 17. (1) As used in this section ‘single room occupancy’**
9 **means a residential development with no fewer than four attached**
10 **units that are independently rented and lockable and provide living**
11 **and sleeping space for the exclusive use of an occupant, but require**
12 **that the occupant share sanitary or food preparation facilities with**
13 **other units in the occupancy.**

14 **“(2) Within an urban growth boundary, each local government shall**
15 **allow the development of a single room occupancy:**

16 **“(a) With up to six units on each lot or parcel zoned to allow for**
17 **the development of a detached single-family dwelling; and**

18 **“(b) With the number of units consistent with the density standards**
19 **of a lot or parcel zoned to allow for the development of residential**
20 **dwellings with five or more units.**

21 **“SECTION 18. ORS 197.303, as amended by section 27, chapter 13, Oregon**
22 **Laws 2023 (Enrolled House Bill 2001), is amended to read:**

23 **“197.303. (1) As used in ORS 197.296 and this section, ‘needed housing’**
24 **means all housing on land zoned for residential use or mixed residential and**
25 **commercial use that is determined to meet the need shown for housing**
26 **within an urban growth boundary at price ranges and rent levels that are**
27 **affordable to households within the county with a variety of incomes, in-**
28 **cluding but not limited to households with low incomes, very low incomes**
29 **and extremely low incomes, as those terms are defined by the United States**
30 **Department of Housing and Urban Development under 42 U.S.C. 1437a.**

1 'Needed housing' includes the following housing types:

2 "(a) Attached and detached single-family housing, middle housing types
3 as described in ORS 197.758 and multiple family housing for both owner and
4 renter occupancy;

5 "(b) Government assisted housing;

6 "(c) Mobile home or manufactured dwelling parks as provided in ORS
7 197.475 to 197.490;

8 "(d) Manufactured homes on individual lots planned and zoned for
9 single-family residential use that are in addition to lots within designated
10 manufactured dwelling subdivisions;

11 "(e) Agriculture workforce housing;

12 "(f) Housing for individuals with a variety of disabilities related to mo-
13 bility or communications that require accessibility features;

14 "(g) Housing for older persons, as defined in ORS 659A.421; [*and*]

15 "(h) Housing for college or university students, if relevant to the
16 region[.]; **and**

17 **"(i) Single room occupancies as defined in section 17 of this 2023
18 Act.**

19 "(2) For the purpose of estimating housing needs, as described in ORS
20 197.296 (3)(b), Metro shall adopt findings and perform an analysis that esti-
21 mates each of the following factors:

22 "(a) Projected needed housing units over the next 20 years;

23 "(b) Current housing underproduction;

24 "(c) Housing units needed for people experiencing homelessness; and

25 "(d) Housing units projected to be converted into vacation homes or sec-
26 ond homes during the next 20 years.

27 "(3) At the time Metro performs the analysis under subsection (2) of this
28 section, Metro shall allocate a housing need for each city within Metro.

29 "(4) In making an allocation under subsection (3) of this section, Metro
30 shall consider:

1 “(a) The forecasted population growth under ORS 195.033 or 195.036;
2 “(b) The forecasted regional job growth;
3 “(c) An equitable statewide distribution of housing for income levels de-
4 scribed in section 2 (4), **chapter 13, Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled House**
5 **Bill 2001)** [*of this 2023 Act*].
6 “(d) The estimates made under subsection (2) of this section; and

29 **“(c)** Is promoted for residential use by agricultural employees and
30 developed with amenities suitable for agricultural employees and their

1 **families;**

2 **“(d) Consists of a multifamily dwelling or a cluster of buildings,**
3 **including manufactured, prefabricated or modular housing, housing**
4 **produced through a three-dimensional printing process or other hous-**
5 **ing developed using innovative construction types; and**

6 **“(e)(A) Is subject to an affordable housing covenant requiring that**
7 **the units are maintained for a period of no less than 60 years as af-**
8 **fordable to rent for low income households, as described in ORS 456.270**
9 **to 456.295;**

10 **“(B) Is operated as a consumer housing cooperative; or**

11 **“(C) Is operated under a model approved by the department de-**
12 **signed to preserve affordability or control of the property by its resi-**
13 **dents.**

14 **“(2) The Housing and Community Services Department shall pro-**
15 **vide one or more grants to qualified housing sponsors for the purposes**
16 **of developing community housing supporting agricultural employees.**

17 **“(3) In awarding grants under this section, the department shall**
18 **prioritize applications:**

19 **“(a) From a developer that is a nonprofit housing corporation that**
20 **serves agricultural workers;**

21 **“(b) From a developer that is a nonprofit that promotes housing for**
22 **agricultural employees or other needs of agricultural employees, or**
23 **from a developer that has entered into a partnership with a nonprofit**
24 **housing corporation that serves agricultural workers for the purposes**
25 **of developing the community housing;**

26 **“(c) Where other funding for the housing development has been**
27 **dedicated or can be leveraged by the grant;**

28 **“(d) Where the housing development will be located close to signif-**
29 **icant agricultural employment; or**

30 **“(e) Where the housing development will include or will be near**

1 specific characteristics or amenities designed to support or attract
2 agricultural employees and their families.

3 “(4) Grants awarded under this section may be used for any project
4 costs for the development or predevelopment of the community hous-
5 ing supporting agricultural employees.

6 “(5) A qualified housing sponsor receiving grants under this section
7 shall agree to provide information to the department to report to an
8 appropriate interim committee of the Legislative Assembly, in the
9 manner provided in ORS 192.245, on the use of the grant on or before
10 September 15, 2027.

11 “SECTION 35. Section 34 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2,
12 2028.

13 “SECTION 36. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
14 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
15 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-
16 eral Fund, the amount of \$10,000,000, to award and administer grants
17 under section 34 of this 2023 Act.

18

19 “LOCAL GOVERNMENT HOUSING SUPPORT

20

21 “SECTION 37. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Ser-
22 vices, in consultation with the Department of Land Conservation and
23 Development and the Housing and Community Services Department,
24 shall provide grants to councils of governments, as defined in ORS
25 294.900, and economic development districts to support housing and
26 community development capacity within cities and counties in this
27 state and within the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in this
28 state.

29 “(2) Councils of governments and economic development districts
30 receiving grants under this section shall partner and consult with local

1 governments, developers, financiers, the Department of Land Conser-
2 vation and Development, the Housing and Community Services De-
3 partment, other relevant state agencies and other interested public
4 and private partners to enable local governments throughout the re-
5 gion to encourage community development and the development of
6 infrastructure and needed housing, as defined in section 23, chapter
7 13, Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled House Bill 2001), by:

8 “(a) Bridging any information gaps;

9 “(b) Identifying and securing needed resources, including
10 infrastructure and community facilities;

11 “(c) Connecting producers of needed housing with consumers of
12 needed housing; and

13 “(d) Working with representatives of historically underrepresented
14 groups to overcome community-specific barriers to obtaining housing.

15 “SECTION 38. Section 37 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2,
16 2034.

17 “SECTION 39. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
18 ation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administra-
19 tive Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the
20 General Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, to provide grants under sec-
21 tion 37 of this 2023 Act.

22

23 **“AFFORDABLE HOMEOWNERSHIP REVOLVING LOAN FUND**

24

25 “SECTION 40. (1) The Housing and Community Services Depart-
26 ment shall make a grant to the Network for Oregon Affordable Hous-
27 ing (NOAH) to establish a revolving loan fund that will allow a
28 first-time home buyer who is purchasing a home, including a share
29 of a cooperative or a condominium unit, in which the purchaser’s eq-
30 uity will be limited, to establish equity at a faster rate while making

1 monthly payments similar to those described in subsection (3)(a)(A)
2 of this subsection. The department may not make a grant under this
3 section until NOAH has demonstrated that it has dedicated to a loan
4 fund described in this section no less than \$7,500,000 of additional pri-
5 vate moneys.

6 “(2) Loans made from the loan fund must be used for the purchase
7 of a dwelling that is subject to an affordability restriction, such as a
8 restriction as described in ORS 456.270 to 456.295, that:

9 “(a) Has the effect of limiting the purchaser’s ability to gain equity
10 from the appreciation of the dwelling’s value; and

11 “(b) Requires that the purchaser be a low income household as de-
12 fined in ORS 456.270.

13 “(3) Loans made from the loan fund must:

14 “(a) Be made only to applicants that have met with an approved or
15 certified housing counseling agency, as described in 24 C.F.R. 214 sub-
16 part B, and have a first-time home buyer program offered by the
17 agency;

18 “(b) Have a term of 20 years or less; and

19 “(c) Have a fixed interest rate that is not more than the greater of:

20 “(A) The rate that would allow monthly amortized principal and
21 interest payments under the term of the loan to be the amount that
22 would result from a 30-year fixed-rate amortized mortgage at the na-
23 tional current average rate as published by a reputable financial
24 source; or

25 “(B) 0.5 percent.

26 “SECTION 41. Section 40 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2,
27 2026.

28 “SECTION 42. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropri-
29 ation, there is appropriated to the Housing and Community Services
30 Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, out of the Gen-

1 eral Fund, the amount of \$7,500,000, to make a grant under section 40
2 of this 2023 Act.

3 **“SECTION 43.** On or before September 15, 2025, and on or before
4 September 15, 2027, the Housing and Community Services Department
5 shall provide a report to an appropriate interim committee of the
6 Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, on the
7 use of the loan funds described in section 40 of this 2023 Act, as re-
8 ported to the department by the Network for Oregon Affordable
9 Housing (NOAH).

10

11 **“AFFORDABLE HOUSING LOAN GUARANTEE FUND**

12

13 **“SECTION 44.** Section 45 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a
14 part of ORS chapter 458.

15 **“SECTION 45.** (1) The Housing and Community Services Depart-
16 ment shall provide grants to one or more nonprofit corporations to
17 develop a fund.

18 **“(2)** The moneys in the fund may be used only to guarantee the
19 repayment of loans to finance the construction of housing subject to
20 an affordable housing covenant for low or moderate income house-
21 holds, as described in ORS 456.270 to 456.295 and as further defined by
22 the Housing and Community Services Department by rule.

23 **“(3)** The term of a loan guaranteed under this section may not ex-
24 ceed five years.

25 **“(4)** The department and the state are not guarantors of any loan
26 guaranteed by a nonprofit corporation under this section.

27 **“(5)** To be eligible for a grant under this section, a nonprofit cor-
28 poration must:

29 **“(a)** Be exempt from income taxes under section 501(c)(3) or (4) of
30 the Internal Revenue Code; and

1 homeless assistance program shall serve individuals experiencing
2 homelessness, especially unsheltered homelessness, without respect to in-
3 come.

4 “(2) The Oregon Housing Stability Council shall develop a policy for the
5 use of program funds with the advice of:

6 “(a) Persons who have experienced housing instability;

7 “(b) Tribes;

8 “(c) The Community Action Partnership of Oregon;

9 “(d) Continuums of care, as defined in 24 C.F.R. part 578;

10 “(e) Local governments;

11 “(f) Nonprofit organizations;

12 “(g) Homeless services providers;

13 “(h) Culturally specific organizations;

14 “(i) Housing providers;

15 “(j) Veterans’ services organizations; and

16 “(k) Other entities identified by the department by rule.

17 “(3) The policy under subsection (2) of this section shall direct that pro-
18 gram funds shall be used:

19 “(a) To provide to low and very low income individuals, including but not
20 limited to individuals more than 65 years of age, persons with disabilities,
21 agricultural workers and Native Americans:

22 “(A) Emergency shelters and attendant services;

23 “(B) Transitional housing services designed to assist individuals to make
24 the transition from homelessness to permanent housing and economic inde-
25 pendence;

26 “(C) Supportive housing services to enable individuals to continue living
27 in their own homes or to provide in-home services for such individuals for
28 whom suitable programs do not exist in their geographic area;

29 “(D) Programs that provide emergency payment of home payments, rents
30 or utilities; [or]

1 **“(E) Support for individuals with companion animals, as defined in**
2 **ORS 401.977, that includes:**

3 **“(i) Food for both companion animals and their owners;**

4 **“(ii) Crates or kennels on-site or off-site that are easily accessible**
5 **to the companion animal owners;**

6 **“(iii) Basic veterinary services, including behavioral services; and**

7 **“(iv) Rules of conduct and responsibility regarding companion ani-**
8 **mals and their owners; or**

9 **“[(E)] (F) Some or all of the needs described in subparagraphs (A) to**
10 **[(D)] (E) of this paragraph.**

11 **“(b) To align with federal strategies and resources that are available to**
12 **prevent and end homelessness, including the requirement of providing cul-**
13 **turally responsive services and using evidence-based and emerging practices**
14 **effective in ending homelessness, including practices unique to rural com-**
15 **munities.**

16 **“(4)(a) The council shall require as a condition of awarding a grant that**
17 **the organization demonstrate to the satisfaction of the council that the or-**
18 **ganization:**

19 **“(A) Has the capacity to deliver any service proposed by the organization;**

20 **“(B) Is a culturally responsive organization or is engaged in a process to**
21 **become a culturally responsive organization;**

22 **“(C) Engages with culturally specific organizations; and**

23 **“(D) Supports local homelessness system planning efforts.**

24 **“(b) Any funds granted under this section may not be used to replace ex-**
25 **isting funds. Funds granted under this section may be used to supplement**
26 **existing funds. An organization may use funds to support existing programs**
27 **or to establish new programs.**

28 **“(5) The department may expend funds from the account for:**

29 **“(a) The administration of the account as provided for in the legislatively**
30 **approved budget, as that term is defined in ORS 291.002, for the department**

1 in support of directing a statewide policy on homelessness that ensures use
2 of evidence-based and emerging practices, service equity in funding and local
3 planning processes.

4 “(b) The development of technical assistance and training resources for
5 organizations developing and operating emergency shelters as defined in ORS
6 197.782 and transitional housing accommodations as described in ORS
7 197.746.

8 “(6) The department shall utilize outcome-oriented contracting processes
9 and evidence-based and emerging practices for account program funds, in-
10 cluding evidence-based and emerging practices for serving rural communities.

11 “(7) Twenty-five percent of moneys deposited in the account pursuant to
12 ORS 294.187 are dedicated to the emergency housing assistance program for
13 assistance to veterans who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

17 **“SECTION 49. The unit captions used in this 2023 Act are provided**
18 **only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the**
19 **statutory law of this state or express any legislative intent in the**
20 **enactment of this 2023 Act.**

“OPERATIVE AND EFFECTIVE DATES

23

24 **“SECTION 50. Sections 2, 17, 29 and 30 of this 2023 Act and the**
25 **amendments to ORS 92.090, 94.550, 100.015, 100.022, 100.105, 100.110,**
26 **100.115, 197.303, 197.830, 215.427 and 227.178 and section 23, chapter 13,**
27 **Oregon Laws 2023 (Enrolled House Bill 2001), by sections 3 to 5, 9 to**
28 **15, 18 and 19 of this 2023 Act become operative on January 1, 2024.**

29

30 **“SECTION 51. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate**
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is

1 **declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**
