16 "SECTION 4. The project approvals and expenditure limitations in 17 sections 1, 2, 3 and 3a of this 2023 Act and the expenditure limitations 18 established by the Emergency Board during the biennium beginning 19 July 1, 2023, for capital construction or acquisition projects, expire on 20 June 30, 2029, unless otherwise noted.
