I am against limits on city government to deny variances on housing developments inside the UGB, and I am against the amendment to allow expansion of UGBs beyond what currently is allowed under Oregon law. Sprawl is already ridiculous in much of urbanized Oregon, and this amendment would make it worse. Local control and influence over property utilization and land use is important, so ordinary people can influence policy. The limits are necessary to prevent further gentrification in the cities, while also limiting sprawl. This whole issue should be brought to citizen assemblies statewide that could help councils, legislatures and other governmental bodies make better decisions without lobbying groups influencing the process.
