In addition, the Oregon Department of Corrections has been attempting to model itself after the Norway prison system. The Norway prison system has been proven to reduce recidivism. One of the main goals of the Norway system is to instill "normalization and humanization" in its inmates. Allowing Oregon inmates to vote would go a long way toward normalization.
