Our Positive Track Record, For Example...

- In 2022, the Harney County Wildfire Collaborative of more than 20 organizations and individuals came together to
 envision, define and find common ground around the Southeast Oregon Wildfire Resilience project. The Southeast
 Oregon Wildfire Resilience project is a wildfire resilience project in Harney and Malheur Counties that is using critical
 fuel treatments to enhance wildfire resilience across sagebrush steppe landscapes in Southeast Oregon.
- First convened in 2011, the Harney Basin Wetlands Collaborative has been successfully working together to enhance
 the private ranching wild flood irrigated wet meadows and restore Malheur Lake. These lands are a critical Pacific
 Flyway rest stop for migratory birds and vital for the southeast Oregon ranching economy. This group has
 successfully implemented more than \$6 million in Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board funding and continued
 working together during the 2016 militia occupation of Malheur National Wildlife Refuge.

- With 15 years of collaboration experience, HDP is ready for this opportunity to expand the culture of collaboration.
- HDP creates and coordinates—not duplicates programs and will work closely with Oregon Solutions to make collaboration more readily available for communities wanting to use the HDP collaborative model.
- This expansion will fill a vital regional gap, as current collaboration services other than what HDP is providing do not extend to southeast Oregon.
- This request is about connecting, engaging and growing community place-based resources that will lead to greater
 ecological resilience, economic growth, and social vitality in remote rural communities while reducing the potential
 for litigation logjams.

- Collaborative Center Building = \$750,000
- Oregon Solutions contract facilitation and experiential community-building in SE Oregon = \$400,000
